

## 200 DIE IN DEFENSE OF IRUN, REPORTER SAYS AFTER FIGHT

IRUN, Sept. 5.—(U.P.)—Accompanying the rebels mopping up in captured Irun, I was able to make an estimate of the dead today.

About 200 rebels were killed or injured, mostly in the capture of outlying Behobie, and 200 defenders were killed in Irun. No civilians were killed. I can formally deny stories published in England that the rebels killed women and children. I saw most of the dead, but not a single woman or child.

Almost the whole of Irun has been destroyed or hopelessly damaged except the Avenue de France leading to the international bridge. In the main street, the Paseo Colon, almost every building was burned or damaged by the bombardment.

The fires still burned but less intensely, since most of the buildings were burned out.

A column of 2000 Carlists and Foreign Legionnaires was formed at the edge of Irun. It will start shortly for Fuenterrabia, charged with capturing that aristocratic town and then sealing the heights to Fort Guadalupe.

Another column, moving south towards San Sebastian, captured the two heights of Zubelzu and Pina, in the direction of Zentao.

At 8 p. m. it could be said not a governmental defender remained in Irun, although snipers were shooting from the French side. This afternoon I found six inhabitants who had remained in Irun throughout the battle. One, Pablo Duarte, 76, old in the basement of the town hall. There were two women, a mother and daughter, who remained in their home and fought the fire successfully.

## TAX PROPOSAL IS THREAT TO REVENUE

Reau indicated that in addition to providing for a 20 per cent reduction by 1942 in the property tax millage to all units of government alike, the assessed valuation of the state would be reduced from \$924,071,620 to \$606,164,213 by the proposed constitutional amendment, which if adopted will be Article II-B of the Oregon constitution.

The proposed measure would limit the 1937 levy to that of 1935 and would reduce the number of mills to be levied in each succeeding year by four per cent until 1942 and subsequent years, when the millage shall not exceed 80 per cent of that levied in 1935. In addition the measure would establish a 50 per cent valuation basis for all assessments.

**Increases Tax Base**  
Since present county assessment ratios vary from 45 to 78 per cent of the total value of the property assessed, the measure would cause counties in which the ratio was below 50 per cent to have a greater tax base on which to make the levy, but those which have a ratio above 50 per cent would find their tax base smaller, it was pointed out by the bulletin.

The bulletin shows that the total 1938 county tax levy for the state, which is \$12,910,485, would be reduced in 1937 under the proposed amendment by \$2,377,070, and in 1942 by \$4,484,769. The present total city tax levy of \$5,632,120 would be cut \$978,324 in 1937 and \$2,502,700 by 1942. Application of the 50 per cent valuation basis would reduce valuations within cities from \$440,550,652 to \$305,721,815, the bulletin shows.

## Your Wife's Appendicitis May Be Only Severe Attack of "Mother-in-lawitis"

SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 5.—(A.P.)—Fears of divorce, like green apples, can cause a wife's stomach-ache.

"And mother-in-law trouble has brought on more than one housewife's case of 'appendicitis,'" Dr. Walter S. Alvarez of the Mayo clinic, told the Utah Medical Association convention today.

He was explaining "why some women are nervous"—and the large feminine section was giving particular attention.

"All this indigestion and pains in the stomach," he smiled. "If you women only knew it, a great part of it is due to your worries."

"In some cases what you need, rather than amputation of the appendix, is removal of the mother-in-law."

"But speaking generally, my advice is: 'Quit being fussy, quit being jealous—particularly over your husband—"

and quit being such a careful housekeeper. Then your nerves won't play tricks on you."

Dr. Alvarez stressed the fact that nervousness in itself is a desirable trait—that the high-strung woman is the more charming and the nervous man the "more valuable."

"A nervous person usually has more intelligence than his more calm fellows, but he goes through hell," he said.

Advising women not to "chase after too many food fads," Dr. Alvarez warned against certain reducing diets and advised a "good, varied diet which avoids extremes."

"Anatomically man is carnivorous; his digestive tract was not built for a vegetable diet. A person can be a vegetarian and get away with it—only if he uses the nutritive foods."

**At St. Mary's School**  
St. Mary's parochial school, operated by the Sisters of the Holy Name, opens its school year on the same date as the city school system does, Sept. 14. Registration for this school will be Friday, September 11, from 9 to 10 a. m. and from 1 to 2 p. m. The building has been renovated and painted throughout the interior. A larger registration is expected this year, particularly in the grades. Rev. Francis P. Leppig, pastor of St. Mary's Catholic school, and Rev. Richard Carberry, assistant at the church, are on the faculty as well as the Sisters operating the school.

**A Roosevelt School**  
Registration for seventh graders at the Theodore Roosevelt junior high school will begin at 9 a. m. Wednesday and will continue throughout the day until 3:30 p. m. with the exception of the noon hour, announces Wendell L. Van Loan, principal. On Thursday, the 8th graders will register and Friday will be given over to ninth graders, both groups from 9 a. m. to 3:30 p. m. Student body officers and Girls' League and Boys' League officers will be present to help new students register and get acquainted with the building. The usual locker rental fee of 50 cents and towel fee of 75 cents will be collected from all pupils. Ninth graders will have an additional fee of \$1.50 for text book rental purposes. This latter fee must be collected because the law only provides for free text books through the eighth grade and in order for the school district to furnish texts free to ninth graders some contribution is required of the pupil. Parents and pupils are advised not to purchase school supplies of any sort until after classes have met and the teachers have had an opportunity to tell the youngsters what would be most suitable in the way of working materials.
