

F. D. PREPARES FOR SECOND TERM AS RUMORS CIRCULATE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today became the hub of a whirlwind of second-term activities that threw off, among other things, official word that the administration was striving for cuts in both federal appropriations and certain taxes.

At the same time the following reports emerged from White House conferences and other authoritative circles:

Reports Listed

That the chief executive and congressional leaders look to further improvement in business to hasten a return on a balanced budget.

That there will be no general shake-up of the cabinet.

That the government will do "very little" borrowing from now on to finance running expenses.

That the Civilian Conservation Corps will be extended after March 31 and made permanent July 1.

That the lending powers of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation will be extended beyond July 1.

That the White House secretariat will remain the same, at least for the time being.

Solons Confer

Chairmen Harrison (D-Miss) and Doughton (D-NC) of the senate and house committees on taxation talked budget and taxes with Mr. Roosevelt. Harrison said afterward the question of eliminating nuisance taxes where administrative costs were "out of all proportion" to the revenue collected was being studied. Possible modification of the levy on undistributed profits of corporations, to ease the burden on companies in debt and those wishing to enlarge their plants, also was under review, he said.

He reiterated there would be no increased taxes at the coming session.

Concerning Mr. Roosevelt's second-term cabinet, one high official predicted there would be no general change in the present lineup. The only secretaryship that may be changed, he added, was the war post now held temporarily by Harry H. Woodring of Kansas.

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LINDBERGH'S YULE TO BE IN ENGLAND

NEW YORK, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Charles A. Lindbergh, America's self-exiled aviation hero, looked forward today to his second successive Christmas day away from his native land with his family.

It was midnight last Dec. 21, when the flier secretly left the country with his wife and baby, Jon Morrow Lindbergh, as the only passengers on the freighter American Explorer. They observed Christmas at sea. Jon had a Christmas tree and hung his stockings over the fireplace in the ship's smoking room.

This year the Lindberghs probably will spend Christmas either at their fourteenth century rambling log house at Weald, a Kentish village south of London, or at the Llandaff home of Aubrey M. Morgan, widowed husband of Mrs. Lindbergh's sister, Elizabeth, who died in 1934.

The Lindberghs had been at sea about 30 hours when the world learned of their flight from the country. Lindbergh's chief reason for leaving was said by friends to be due to the uncertainty of the execution of Bruno Richard Hauptmann, convicted kidnaper of his child, found slain on Sourland mountain, New Jersey, nearly five years ago.

He has not indicated whether he plans to return to America.

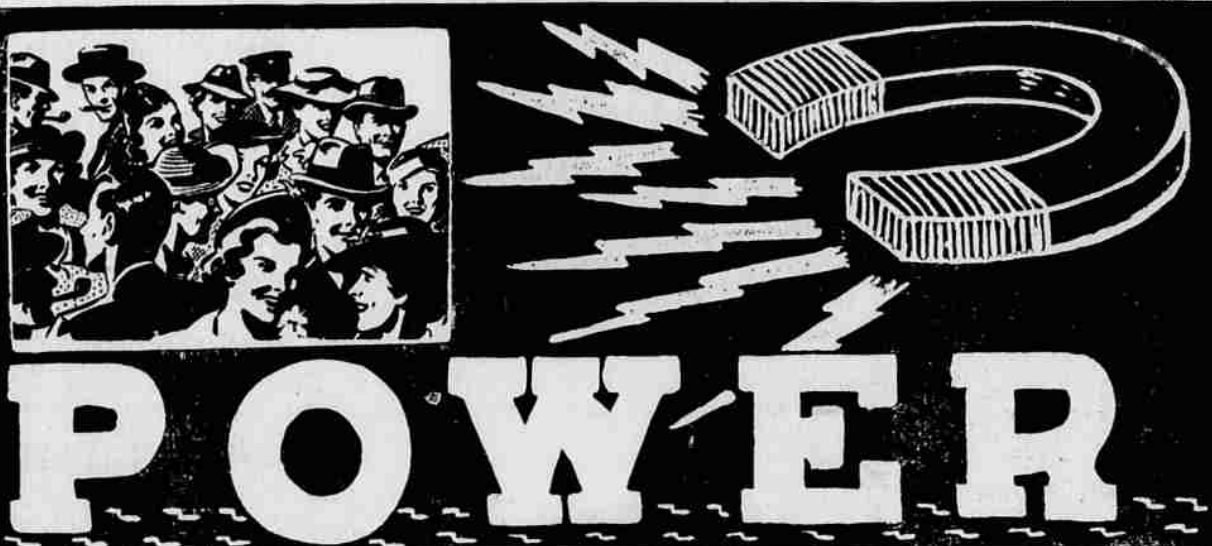
