MILK BOARD HEAD RAPS PROPAGANDA

CORVALLIS, Ore., Jan. 21.—(AP)—Discussions of Oregon's milk control law gave way to business sessions at the Oregon Dairymen's association parley today following a talk by Edgar W. Smith of Portland, milk board chairman, who blamed agitation against control on "propaganda paid for by selfish interests."

Smith told the group income of producers had been augmented by \$5,000,000 since inception of the control program nearly two years ago. He also pointed out that the board acts under legislative authority, and said retail prices are lower, quality considered, than at any time since 1918 with the exception of middle-pressures.

In commenting on agitation in Portland against the board's action in boosting milk prices, Smith said even more drastic public control, possibly public ownership of distribution systems, would be brought into effect eventually if the present control act is repealed.

Codification of the state's agricultural laws, with changes where necessary, was advocated by Arden A. Reed, chief of the market enforcement division of the state department of agriculture, in order to make uniform enforcement possible.

Fourteen School Kids Ride In Patrol Wagon
