

FAILING WEBFEET DROP COURT TILT TO "HOT" VANDALS

Flashing a surprising last half scoring drive against a badly offed University of Oregon quintet, the Idaho Vandals fought their way to a fierce 35-31 win at McArthur court last night. The victory was the first in eight starts for the Vandals this season.

Husky little Steve Belko, who counted 12 points, sparked the Vandal win with his constant fight and drive. High point man for the evening however was Oregon's Dave Silver, who scored six field goals and six free tosses to run up a total of 18 points.

The game started out listlessly, with neither team able to find the range on the opponents basket. Oregon looked like anything but a college ball club as they tried shot after shot from close in under the Vandals' net to no avail. Finally Dave Silver found the range and dropped in two of his special one-handed push shots from the side. Early shot one in from the foul circle, and Lewis also connected. At the same time Kramer and Belko of Idaho were also beginning to get the range and at the ten-minute point the score stood at 12 to 7 for the Webfoots.

Play Speeds Up
The next ten minutes of the game saw the play speed up materially. Johnny Lewis and Ken Purdy seemed to be having an "off-night," and were replaced by Wally Johansen and Bill Courtney. Many fumbles, and more football than basketball featured the play, and the score at the half stood at 16 to 14 in favor of Oregon. Wintermute and Silver made Oregon's other two points, while Kramer and Johnson were pulling Idaho closer with some nice shots from outside the foul circle.

A close see-saw second half saw Idaho go into the lead 18-17 after five minutes were gone. Slim Wintermute put the Ducks back into the game for the last time when he connected with a beautiful push shot from the side. Kramer, whose five field goals were all scored from practically the same position, lofted his fourth left-handed push shot into the net. Winter and Smith followed with shots from close in to give Forest Twoogood's men a 28-24 advantage with five minutes left in the game.

Feature of the Webfoots' final drive was Wally Johansen's solo dash down the floor to hole out a crumple and bring Oregon to within two points, 29-31, of the Vandals.

At this point Kramer was left open in his corner long enough to cast off with another of his accurate shots, and Winter scored two free throws after Courtney's foul. Silver's last minute cast from the side brought the final count to 35-31.

For the winners in that tourney, however, there will still be the district play-offs, and perhaps the state championships at Salem in latter March.

In the tough eastern league Coburg's Broncos hold the division gonfalon. The Broncos came through a difficult season in fine shape. They were undefeated until February 5, when Pleasant Hill finally accomplished the difficult task, winning by two points. Now the Broncos have one of their hardest hurdles ahead of them—Triangle Lake Saturday night, to see which team will get the top position in the tournament draw.

In the central division little Thurston, last year's county champions, have gone through the season undefeated. In 21 straight games the Panthers have lost but one encounter—and that to Santa Clara, strong tournament contender.

In the western division Triangle Lake is 1937 winner—undefeated in league play. They meet Coburg Saturday night, as mentioned above, for the right to hold the favored top spot in the tourney draw—the spot which will give them the best chance of reaching the finals.

Regular play is over. Some teams have had hard luck. Some have gone through their schedules in fine style. But they'll all have an equal chance in the tournament!
