

# UNIVERSITY ART SCHOOL PRAISED FOR ACHIEVEMENT

Art at the University of Oregon, in the school of architecture and allied arts and on the campus itself, is far advanced, and much of it deserving of national recognition, it was declared here this week by Joseph A. Danysh, San Francisco, regional director for federal art projects, who spent several days here in company with Rust Brown Barker, university vice-president.

Mr. Danysh, a nationally known critic of art, was enthusiastic particularly over the wrought iron gates for the new library, the interior of the structure, and sculpture of Oliver Laurence Barrett, head of the sculpture department. He also warmly commended the work in architecture that is being done in the art school, and paid tribute to Ellis F. Lawrence, dean of the school and architect for the university.

The wrought iron gates will serve as a memorial to Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, president of the university from 1926 to 1932. The art work in these gates is as great as any done anywhere in the United States, Mr. Danysh declared. The art critics also spent some time in the upper division reading room of the library building, and he cited this as probably the outstanding room, from the standpoint of art, of any in the country.

The statue, "Paul Bunyan and the Blue Ox," created by Professor Barrett, won the highest praise from Mr. Danysh. It should be erected in the northwest where it would attract interest of art lovers from all over the world, he declared. The sculptural technique, design, form and the idea of the whole greatly impressed him, Mr. Danysh stated.

Mr. Danysh is a graduate in fine arts of the University of California. He has conducted his own art gallery and has studied extensively in many fields. He is regarded as an authority on many phases of art, and the federal position he holds is a recognition of his standing. It is pointed out, Mr. Barker is state director for federal art projects, and conferred with Mr. Danysh on local projects while the two were together here.

## Oregon State Man Gets Play Award

## PORTUGUESE LINE UP AS NEUTRALS

Portugal today was declared ready to join Europe's neutrality barricade of the Spanish civil war, completing the list of 27 nations trying to stifle the conflict through non-intervention. The general neutrality scheme, including a ban on foreign volunteers and a patrol system to guard against arms movements in the war zone, is scheduled to become effective tomorrow at midnight.

Madrid's defenders, meanwhile, claimed a measure of success in their bitter stand at the gate of the capital. Reports said the government troops had plunged into insurgent lines at Pinzaron hill in a desperate attempt to silence artillery which has swept the all-important highway to Valencia. The road still was under government control, but was swept by insurgent fire.

While London awaited final instructions from Lisbon on a compromise solution for Portugal in the neutrality agreement, France launched investigation of reports insurgent artillery had been trained on her Pyrenees border.

## Steiner Would Let People Decide

SEASIDE, Feb. 19.—(AP)—Senator Frederick Steiner said today the president's proposed reorganization of the supreme court should be authorized by the people through a constitutional amendment. The statement was made in a letter to the Peuleton Young Democrats club.

"I will support many of the changes suggested by the president, including voluntary retirement at an age to be fixed by law. I regard as unsafe the proposal to permit appointment of six new judges at one time," said Steiner.

## Independent Bank Group to Expand

PULLMAN, Wash., Feb. 19.—(AP)—Grain buyers estimated here today that 85 per cent of the 1935 wheat crop of the Palouse region has been sold, with 15,000 bushels moving from farms in the past week. Sales ranged from 10 1/2 to 90 cents. Grain men predicted little of the crop would be held over.

ervation and development of resources here would be an object lesson to the entire nation. It is no longer possible to expand as in the past, he said, and further expansion would have to take place in the development of economic possibilities, the elimination of waste and the stimulation of production.

**Flood Control Is Vital**  
The key to the Friday meeting, in his opinion, was the biching of the Willamette project to the nation's flood and erosion control program that is sure to come in the near future.

He pointed out that the projected irrigation program alone would double the amount of productive farm land in the Lane county and hence double its trading area. Power development on the Middle Fork, McKenzie, and North Santiam rivers would make available 620,000 additional horsepower for use in homes, factories, farms and cities. Stabilization of the river flow through storage dams would reduce stream pollution 50 per cent and would boost power generation at Oregon City 2 1/2 times. Bank protection and lock construction would give river boats a six-foot channel to the mouth of the Santiam, a 5 1/2-foot channel to Albany, a 4 1/2-foot channel to Corvallis, and a three-foot channel to Eugene.

The measure would allow counties to assume responsibility for the completion of projects related to the flood control program.

## Bill Prohibiting Clam Digging Signed

SALEM, Feb. 19.—(AP)—Governor Charles H. Martin signed today a bill passed in the legislature, prohibiting

the digging of clams and oysters in the Shuslaw bay and river for commercial purposes. The bill provided that three dozen clams or oysters could be taken in one day for personal use, and that commercial diggers would be allowed to have for sale no more than 15 dozen of such clams and oysters in one day.
