Grain Prices Drop On Chicago Market

CHICAGO, March 13.—(AP)—Influenced by predictions of additional moisture over the weekend in domestic dry areas, wheat needed an early start today, and went under early bottom quotations. Downturns of wheat prices were in the face of prospects of smaller world shipments. This was expected to result in some reduction of stocks of wheat afloat for importing countries. At the close, wheat was 7-8 1/2¢ lower, compared with yesterday's finish, May 1.34 1/4@3.8. July 1.17 7-8@1.18, corn 1.86 1/2-5.8 up, May 1.08 3-8@1 1/2, July 1.04 3-8@1 1/2, oats 1.86 3-8 off, and provisions unchanged to 12 cents up.
