NEW YORK, July 21.—(AP)—Notables scribbled on a wine card as the S. S. Bernartia, burning the Ryder Cup team and Tommy Farr slid through the harbor to her North River berth.

Farr, who challenges Joe Louis next month, was flattered three years ago by a gentleman who didn't even trouble to remove his topcoat or monocle. . . . Farr was working as a circus strong man, meeting all comers. . . . In walked the stylishly dressed fellow and, after a careful scrutiny of Farr, he said: "I fancy I'll take you." . . . No one was more surprised than Farr when the "toff" proceeded to knock him out inside a round.

Farr told this story and said that anyone who doubted it could write to Hopkins Davis, Esq., London, for proof. . . . Hopkins Davis is the "toff" . . . Mike Jacobs heard Farr tell the press this story and nearly swooned. . . . Mike knows that fighters knocked out by innocent bystanders make little copy. . . . so he said to Tommy: "But that was a long time ago, when you were a boy." . . . "No, it wasn't," answered the Welshman. "It was only a few years ago."

The fact still remains, however, Louis can knock an opponent kicking with one punch. . . . And Farr has no knockout punch. . . . All he has is tremendous toughness and a fine left hand. . . . Henry Pickard has a twisted wrist and probably won't play golf for three months. . . . Dennis Shute wants another crack at Henry Cotton, but on this side of the Atlantic. . . .
