Glacier Ballet New

As the fireworks die away, the glacier ballet, an innovation in the pageant this year, depicts the march of the glaciers and the meeting of the rivers. The dancers of this scene, under the direction of Mildred LeCompte Moore, represent the form of the valleys from the chaos of volcanic eruption and the beauty of the scene thoroughly justifies its inclusion in the script.

The dancing is one of the true highlights of the pageant production, outstripping the dances of all previous pageants.

their cars on the streets where the parade will pass. Streets will be cleared at 9 o'clock, and everyone is asked not to leave his car in these streets.

Parade Instructions

Everyone in the parade will receive his number and instructions about forming at Pageant headquarters Friday. Those in the parade from the grand marshal to the national guards will form on east Thirteenth. Others will receive instructions on the back of their number cards. Motor clubs and motorcycles to aid the committee in forming the parade, which will be the largest of any previous Pageant, are donated by Clarence N. Crocker and the Eugene Motorcycle club.

According to Wintler, 160 floats will be in the parade, and it will be the largest of the Pageant parade ever presented. Many cities have sent bands, drill teams, marching organizations, delegations and floats, and princesses to share the rule of the royal court, and these will all be represented in Saturday's parade.

At 12:30, Pioneer Village on the fairgrounds will open, to run all day. Authentic and reproduced pioneer costumes will be modeled at the Spinnaker's guest luncheon and style show at 1:30 o'clock. Tickets may be obtained at Pageant headquarters.

Art Museum Open

From 2 until 5 o'clock, the Murray Warner Oriental art museum will be open to the public. At 2:30 the air meet of the Private Fliers' association will be held at the airport, with exhibitions, contests, and passenger flights.

A tea for visiting ladies will be given at Gerlinger hall on the university campus from 3:30 until 4:30 in the afternoon, under the direction of Mrs. Dan E. Clark. From 4:30 till 5:30 the public may view modern aircraft on display at the airport.

At 8:30 the final showing of the great Oregon Trail Pageant will be held on the Pageant stage at the fairgrounds, and at 11 o'clock the huge pioneer celebration will wind up with the queen's ball at Settlers' Valley (Willamette Park), with special honors being given Queen Susannah IV (LaVonne Ledahl) and her court.

Pottlatch Gulch Fun trail carnival will be open from 10 in the morning until 12 at night.

LUMBER PRODUCTION RISES DURING WEEK

SEATTLE, July 27.—(AP)—A total of 175,000 and operating mills in Washington and Oregon reported to the West Coast Lumbermen's Association today they produced 127,334, 319 feet of lumber during the week ended July 17.

At the rate of cutting at the reporting mills, the entire industry produced 80.9 per cent of the average weekly cut during 1936-37.

New business reported taken last week by the 175 mills was 92,579,483 board feet. Shipments were 127,544,002 feet. Unfilled orders totaled 481,230,487 feet.

Production by these mills for the week was nearly equal to the last two weeks in June. A marked decrease in the week ending July 10 was caused by holiday shut-downs during the period.

The association said many mills have refused orders because offerings were below production costs. Because of this condition many mills were reported to have notified their crews production for this month and for August will be less than that for June.

Pioneer fire vehicles, newspaper press, horse-power treadmill, threshing mills and the stage coach used on the Grants Pass-Crescent City route featured existing equipment used in frontier days. Old-time logging outfits, dragging huge logs, rumbled through the streets, while one-horse buggies, pack-horses and loose horses clattered along the pavement.

In the automobile section, which brought up the rear, cars ranging in vintage from the 1887 Sears, 1903 International and 1906 Ro to a 1922 Chevrolet rattled past. Old-time bicycles completed this division of pioneer modes of transportation.

Guests of honor in the reviewing stand were Secretary of State and Mrs. Earl Swift, Mr. and Mrs. Burr Brown Barker and their guest, Charles Hill, of Montclair, New Jersey, one of the largest lumber operators in the southern pine area of the United States.

Mormons in New York Holding Pageant to Celebrate Founding

PALMYRA, N. Y., July 27.—(AP)—Thousands of Mormons turned today to pageantry to commemorate the arrival of Brigham Young's pioneers in Salt Lake City.

Coming here, to the spot revered as the birthplace of the faith, members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, will depict Mormon history on a terraced, open air stage on the sacred hill of Camorah tonight and Saturday and Sunday nights.

A pageant titled "America's Witness for Christ," adapted from the book will be presented tonight and Sunday. Tomorrow night, a Utah state holiday, the cast will depict the historic migration of the Mormon pioneers to the great Salt Lake valley.

President Don B. Colton of the eastern states mission, said approximately 10,000 persons will witness the pageantry from the foot of the hill. In its summer Mormon doctrine says, the boy Joseph Smith received from the Angel Moroni, the golden plates from which the book of Mormon was translated.

NEW SET-UP SEEN IN LUMBER UNIONS

A new policy in A. F. of L. dealings with the lumber unions of the northwest loomed as a distinct possibility Friday as a move to offset the recent C. I. O. affiliation of the Woodworkers' Federation.

What high officials of the Carpenters and Joiners indicated at a session of the Willamette valley district council Thursday evening was this:

That the Brotherhood relied on its previous disapproval of a woodworkers' organization, and encourage the formation of an association of all lumber locals.

Previously the Brotherhood, which has jurisdiction over all loyal A. F. of L. lumber unions, had termed the Woodworkers' Federation an "illegal" organization. It was claimed that the federation had no standing with the A. F. of L., and that any action it took was not binding or official.

Now that the Woodworkers' Federation convention has held the A. F. of L. officials of the Brotherhood indicated that they would not object if the remaining A. F. of L. lumber locals formed a federation. Just what powers this proposed organization would have were not made clear, although it was expected that the Brotherhood would retain all jurisdictional powers over lumber workers.

Bandon Will Keep On Fighting For "Model City" Plan

BANDON, July 27.—(AP)—Bandon city officials resolved today to exhaust all possible channels of federal aid before giving up hope of replacing the town which fire destroyed last fall with the proposed "model city."

The council will mail Saturday to city creditors forms for a proposed refunding plan in the hope the RFC will approve a \$200,000 loan for a 20-year period, despite word from administrator E. J. Griffith that WPA help will not be available.

The refunding plan requires 80 per cent of the creditors agree to

accept cash for 25 per cent of the outstanding bonds and 50 per cent of the certificates.
