

MAJOR BATTLE ON IN NORTH CHINA

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Chinese control of this position must be broken before Japanese control of North China can be secure. It has been the scene of countless battles since the days of Ghenghis Khan. It was there that the late Marshal Chang Tso-Lin, while dictator of Manchuria, made his brief tenure of power in Peiping by defeating Marshal Feng Yu-Hsiang in the North China civil war of a decade ago. Chang took the position by a cavalry attack from the west—sending Mongols from his western territory.

General indications were that the situation was moving slowly towards a major Chinese-Japanese war.

Developments included:

In Nanking the newly formed supreme war council, headed by Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek, central government chief, debated the details of general strategy and the allotment of men to be furnished by the provincial leaders. Chiang was represented as still loath to risk major hostilities as long as there is the slightest chance of a peaceful solution. In this view he is supported by Marshal Yen Hui-Shan, the veteran pacification commissioner for Shansi and Suiyuan provinces, and opposed by Gen. Pai Chang-Hsi, of Kwangsi province, and Liu Hsiang, of Szechuan.
