LUMBER PRODUCTION
INCREASES IN N. W.

SEATTLE, Aug. 6.—(Special)—Lumber production of 170,000,000 board feet in Washington and Oregon in 1936, according to the National Lumber Manufacturers Association, was an increase of 11,000,000 board feet over 1935.

The increase was due to the fact that the mills in the Pacific Northwest have been operating at a higher level of production than in previous years.

The total production of lumber in the Northwest in 1936 was valued at \$1,100,000,000, an increase of \$100,000,000 over 1935.
