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FOREST SERVICE

PORTLAND, Aug. 12.—(Special) Gifford Pinchot, first chief of the United States forest service, is seeing changes in the service since his own time and is "tickled to death" with what he has found, he said here.

He is planning an autobiographical account of the early days of the organization.

The only thing that has not improved, he told interviewers, is the spirit of the men. "But I will say that the spirit now is just as good," he said.

He was accompanied by Dr. H. S. Graves, dean of the school of forestry of Yale university, and Herbert A. Smith of the forest service.

Pinchot, who is also former governor of Pennsylvania, declined to discuss reports that he might seek to represent that state in the senate.

He reiterated his opposition to the proposed efforts of Secretary Ickes to transfer the forest service from the agricultural to the interior department.

**Western Pine Mills
Business Takes Drop**

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 12.—(Special) New business totaling 64,000,000 feet, or a decrease of 12 per cent below the previous week, was reported today by Western Pine Association for week ended Aug. 7, based on reports of 111 mills.

Shipments were 68,350,000 feet and production 92,771,000 feet.

The same mills for the corresponding week a year ago showed orders 78,050,000 feet and production 85,154,000 feet. For the period from Jan. 1 to date orders were 14 per cent above the same period a year ago.
