"When you set out on this road of regulating hours and wages by the federal government," he said, "and say that no one shall work for more than 40 hours a week, you may next have a reduction to 35 hours, then 30 hours, then possibly 25 hours."

This, Gannett contended, would raise production costs.

"And you can't restrict production without lessening the production of wealth. When we produce less and less, there is less and less to divide, and that means less prosperity for everyone."

HIGHWAY OFFICE TO ISSUE BONDS

PORTLAND, Aug. 12.—(AP)—The State Highway commission will issue \$1,000,000 worth of short term bonds, bearing interest of not to exceed one per cent, to obtain funds to match federal money for highway construction during the remainder of the year.

The commission decided at a meeting here last night to issue the bonds in preference to borrowing the amount from the state treasury at a statutory interest rate of two per cent.

Subterranean Disturbance In Idaho Transforms Fertile Farm Into New And Deep Canyon Bed

BOULDER, Ida., Aug. 12.—(AP)—Earth-shaking booms and spurting clouds of yellow volcanic dust today marked progress of a violent subterranean disturbance which is forming a new and deep canyon seven miles west of here.

Five acres of rich land on H. A. Robertson's farm has sunk approximately 200 feet in the last 14 days.

Huge cracks, apparently bottomless, are ripping through 17 more acres on Robertson's farm. Latest crack is a quarter of a mile from his home, and is getting bigger.

Crack formation is marked by muffled detonations, like dynamite blasts. Persons watching the phenomena said the earth shook and clouds of dust shot into the air.

The land, located a short distance east of the old Salmon River canyon, is rapidly sinking, transforming a hill into a valley about half a mile long.

Robertson abandoned the land when disturbances became violent, and is watching the canyon growing day by day, guarding against possible engulfing of his home.

He said for the last three years the land has been noticeably cracking. He has diverted the course of a private irrigation canal several times to prevent the water from sinking into the earth.

Latest cracks are about eight feet from his canal, and are spreading into a network which threatens to honey-

ARMY CARAVANS STARTING NORTH

TACOMA, Wash., Aug. 12.—(AP)—Caravans of United States army trucks rolled through the Pacific northwest today as Ft. Lewis prepared for its share of the gigantic fourth army maneuvers, which begin here Aug. 17.

The truck caravans were bound for points in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana to pick up national guardsmen and regular army troops which will take place in the monster concentration. Virtually all of the transportation of troops is to be handled by truck.

Trucks attached to the ninth and tenth field artillery regiments will carry the bulk of the transport duty, although motorized units of the national guard are to provide their own transportation.

At the fort itself, officers announced everything was ready for the troops. Elaborate maneuvers have been arranged for the entire ten-day training period; while locations for temporary camps at Ft. Lewis and Camp Murray have already been selected.

NOTED NOVELIST DIES IN FRANCE

SAINT BRICE SOUS BOIS, France, Aug. 12.—(AP)—Edith Wharton, the noted American novelist, died yesterday at her chateau near here, it was learned today.

The author of "Ethan Frome" and many other stories was 75 years old. Death occurred yesterday, following an apoplectic stroke.

Miss Wharton will be buried in the Protestant cemetery at Versailles tomorrow.

She had lived in France for nearly 35 years and had written many books about this country.

Shortly before her death, Miss Wharton finished a book of short stories for October publication, and was working on a new novel when she died. Mrs. Max Farrand, wife of the noted historian, a niece, is the only known relative.
