M'REYNOLDS OFF ON EUROPE TRIP

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—(AP)—Associate Justice James Clark McReynolds, hale and hearty and in high good humor, put arduous supreme court duties aside until fall as he sailed Wednesday on the liner Queen Mary for a European vacation.

The justice, quick of step belting his 75 years, brushed aside lights all questions having to do with official problems and engaged, instead, in quick repartee with friends and reporters.

Natly dressed in a gray suit, gray hat, and wearing a dark blue, white-dotted bow tie, the justice was besieged by autograph hunters as he made his way to his stateroom. Hooking his cane over his left arm he complied willingly with requests.

"What do I get out of all this?" he inquired, smiling broadly as pictures were snapped. He laughed heartily as one interviewer suggested Clark Gable, the movie star, never drew so much attention when he sailed.

"Has the constitution gone?" someone asked.

With a great smile, he returned the question quickly.

"What do you think?" he said.

Justice McReynolds, who was appointed to the court by President Woodrow Wilson just 25 years ago this month, returned only a few days ago from the Pacific coast. He was lavish in his praise of developments there and the beauty of the scenery.

FALL PROSPECTS HELP BUSINESS

NEW YORK, Aug. 13.—(AP)—Improvement of fall prospects rather than acceleration dominated the week's trade, Dun & Bradstreet said today.

"Oppressive heat and intermittent showers interfered with shipping plans in so many districts that some of the leading centers of distribution failed to equal their sales of the week preceding; the general average, however, was higher by one to three per cent," the survey said.

"Response to August promotions, some of which featured merchandise under replacement values, provided the major contribution to the moderate increase in retail distribution this week.

"Apparel with which to combat the heat was in demand, while knit goods, sportswear, and vacation accessories continued to sell well.

"Most of the principal centers, however, were well occupied with replacement requests for current promotions and related orders for merchandise for early-September selling."
