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HIGHWAY MISHAPS TOPIC AT FORUM

The third of the series of open forums at the Baites was conducted Sunday afternoon with the subject, "Death on Our Highways," forming the basis of discussion. Dr. James Stewart, speaking from the standpoint of a physician, called attention to "unusual" causes, including heart failure, fainting. Dr. Stewart stated that a driver's judgment is a large factor in causing accidents. He said drink even in moderate quantities tends to aggravate overconfidence in the driver, to slow down his reaction time, to make worse narrow, or tunnel vision, to dull and make less accurate the judgment, makes the driver abusive and non-cooperative. He said that a man fairly drunk could go through the mechanical habitual action of driving, but that he was terribly disqualified for rapid, intelligent action in an unusual situation.

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Valley Hop Groups Tour College Farm To See Experiments

CORVALLIS, Aug. 18.—(AP)—Willamette valley hop growers toured experimental facilities of the federal and state governments at Oregon State college yesterday to inspect the work accomplished in improving the industry. They saw a new 10-acre tract for experimental culture, a 5 1/2-acre breeding yard and an 11 1/2-acre disease control test plot. A satisfactory spray has been developed against mildew, said G. R. Hoerner, federal specialist. R. E. Fore, of the college crops department, reported studies were under way on cultural practices such as late cutting vines, fertilizers, crowing and suckering and cover crops. The growers examined 45 foreign varieties and scores of hybrids, many of them giving promise as disease resisters.
