

FATHER DIVINE TO "EVAPORATE"

NEW YORK, Aug. 19.—(AP)—There was little jubilation in Harlem's "No. 1" today. Less than a ton of roast chicken was consumed; the shouts of "Peace, Mr. Wonderful" and "Thank You, Father" could scarcely be heard a block away; the stamping of feet in black ways was reduced to a rumble no louder than a passing subway train. For Father Divine, the shiny-pated, slightly built negro cult leader has threatened to "evaporate" himself. "Father's disgusted," said his attorney, Arthur A. Madison. "He has just about decided to evaporate for 1000 years."

A plague of lawsuits, brought by disgruntled "angels" who want more than \$20,000, has definitely annoyed Harlem's "God".

But his followers were not the only ones worried by his threat to "evaporate."

Attorney William W. Leshbaum hurried into state supreme court, and on the ground that a threatened disappearance for 1000 years might further delay disposition of legal proceedings against Father Divine, asked for the immediate posting of a \$20,000 bond, or appointment of a receiver for all of the Divine "heavens."

Leshbaum is counsel for Mrs. Veranda Brown, negro ex-"angel," who bids back \$4,000 she says she gave Divine in exchange for a promise of everlasting life.

Private Vocational Schools in Oregon To All Be Licensed

SALEM, Aug. 19.—(AP)—All private vocational schools in Oregon and their salesmen now are being licensed under a 1937 law designed to eliminate "fly-by-night" schools which do not give students good value for the money they paid for an education. C. A. Howard, state superintendent of public instruction, said today.

About half of the schools have

made application for licenses and the others are expected to apply within a few days. Each school must post a \$2,500 bond and each salesman a \$1,000 bond to guarantee

they will conduct their business under the terms of the law. Howard warned any student intending to enter such an institution to request to see the licenses of the school and salesman.

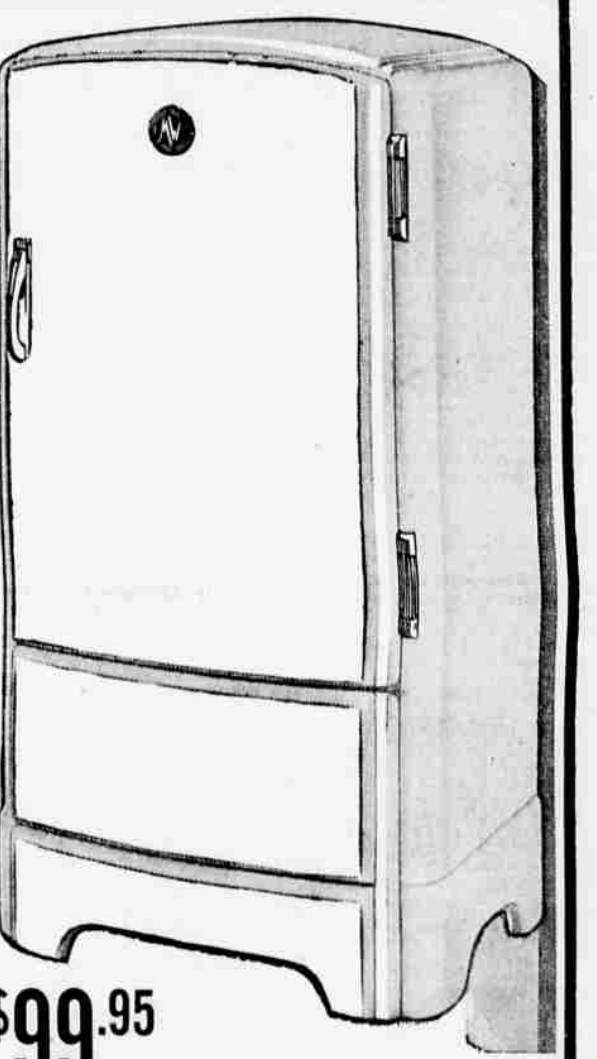
