

U. O. SAVANT TELLS OF DEATH PROPHETS

PORTLAND, Sept. 1.—(P)—Prophets of the blood stream—abnormal cells which predict death within a week, were described here today by Dr. Edwin E. Osgood, professor of experimental medicine at the University of Oregon medical school.

The cells which forecast death for their host are normally present in the blood stream, Dr. Osgood said, but take on a different appearance when death is near.

When seen under the microscope, Dr. Osgood explained, the abnormal cells show granules, or grains, normally not present; the stain used to make them visible shows a deeper blue, and the cells show vacuoles, or holes, in their surfaces.

Death was correctly predicted in over 90 per cent of more than 100 consecutive cases in Multnomah county hospital when blood samples showed characteristic holes in conjunction with toxic granules, Dr. Osgood relates in his new book, "Atlas of Hematology."

Studies described in the atlas produced further evidence that cancer and leukemia, a fatal blood disease, are allied ailments. Leukemia cells show characteristic enlargement of the nucleus, a small clear-staining portion

within the nuclei, the central deep-staining part of a cell, Dr. Osgood said. The condition is typical of cancerous cells.

Dr. Osgood also announced invention of a new, simplified system of blood cell classification for identification of individual blood cells according to size, color, granulation and nuclear structure.

Dr. Osgood perfected the apparatus which propagated individual cells outside the body for the first time in medical history. Dr. Alex. Carrel has grown tissue in the laboratory, but separate cell culture was impossible before the Osgood technique was developed.

Mrs. Chaney Hurt In Auto Collision

Suffering from injuries received in a head-on automobile accident early Wednesday morning, Mrs. J. O. Chaney of Lowell is in the Eugene hospital. Mrs. Chaney's physician reported that she suffered a fracture and dislocation of the left hip and multiple bruises and lacerations.

Mr. and Mrs. Chaney were near their home at Lowell when the accident occurred. Mr. Chaney was driving his car, but the name of the operator of the other vehicle was not reported.

The Chaney's were enroute home from Eugene where they had been to a movie in which their nephew, son of the late Lon Chaney, appeared. Mr. Chaney is a brother of Lon Chaney, who was prominent in the movies before his death.
