Sessions will begin at ten o'clock in the morning, followed by a luncheon at the Osburn hotel at noon.

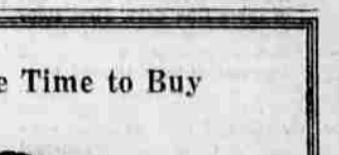
