Tea Given

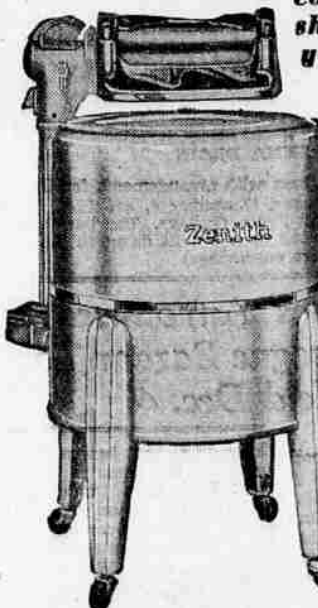
