Sheriff Assists
In Discouraging
Thefts Of Stock

Every effort is being made by the Lane county sheriff's office to help farmers and poultry raisers to discourage stock and poultry thieves from operating in the county. Several reports of losses by theft have been made the past few weeks.

This is the time of the year when livestock and poultry are in condition to market and are very convenient for the night prowler. Every interested person should do all he can to assist the officers in discouraging these losses and to assist in the detection of the thief. One officer said Saturday.

"To assist in this effort let us encourage you to brand or mark your livestock with a recorded brand. Be sure your brand is properly recorded with the state department of agriculture, otherwise it is not a legal brand or mark."

Further instructions are given in a bulletin, as follows: "When hauling livestock on the road be sure to have a bill of sale or proper evidence of ownership that the officer may be sure you are rightly the owner of the livestock. In the case of poultry or veal, either dead or alive, be sure to have the necessary sheriff's tags attached. These tags do not cost you anything and are for your protection. All markets and firms buying poultry have been advised to require tags on each coop of birds. These tags may be secured at the sheriff's office or from the deputies at Junction City and Cottage Grove. In case of loss do not delay in notifying the officers. Phone 26 during the day or 1607 on night calls. These calls will be given prompt attention.
