University, College Enrollment Climbs

Spring term enrollment at the University of Oregon is expected to pass the 3000 mark for the first time in the history of the institution, thus maintaining the record registration set the previous two terms of this year, it was announced at noon Tuesday, the second day of registration.

A total of 2768 students had drawn registration material, C. L. Constance, assistant registrar, stated. This is approximately a five per cent increase over the corresponding time last year.

Income Tax Returns Drop 30 Per Cent From 1938 Figure

WASHINGTON, March 21.—(AP)—The treasury announced today income tax collections during the first 20 days of March amounted to \$473,122,052, about 30 per cent below last year's figure but more than had been estimated in the president's budget.

The report was the first comprehensive guide the treasury has had on revenue it will receive from 1938 income.

SAN QUENTIN, Cal., March 21.—(AP)—Authorities of San Quentin prison acted today to break the second hunger strike of convicts in two months, and hinted at a plan to revoke the good behavior credits of strike leaders.

France Mobilizes Workers By Decrees

PARIS, March 21.—(AP)—The authorized 60-hour work week—the first product of Premier Daladier's new dictatorial powers—was extended today to railways, miners and numerous other industries.

Moving rapidly to whip French productive capacity into shape to match Germany's, the Daladier government announced also that a work week longer than 60 hours may be authorized if found necessary.

A communique said any person on relief who refused to accept work on national defense would be dropped from relief rolls for a year.

The announcement was part of a quick national defense reorganization, for which decree laws were issued.

The 16 decrees, signed yesterday by President Albert Lebrun, not only signaled intensified production of war materials and a revamped military command system along the German frontier but authorized the government to call reservists to the colors.

Three of the 16 decrees, ordered published in this morning's official Journal, were considered military measures; nine were for increased production, while the other four were "miscellaneous."

French political observers considered them but the first of a series designed to put France on an equal footing with totalitarian states in rapid military action.

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1) give the owner three days to appear. If he has not shown up in that time, we send out notices, but if we cannot find the name of the owner here, we must first write to Salem.

Letters Necessary

"In order to facilitate this work, we allow the tags to accumulate till we have a good sized bunch when we write to Salem to find the names. Thus it may be a week or 10 days from the time a tag is placed on a car till we know to whom the machine belongs."

In 1938, the city of Eugene did not receive ownership records on licenses issued in May until December, Mr. Bryan pointed out. Both Bryan and Mayor Large declared they believed it should be possible for the records to be sent out to cities each week so that local police departments would be able to determine ownerships immediately.

Approximately 800 traffic tickets were issued in January and of this number, Eugene had no ownership records in 75 per cent of the cases, Bryan said. In February approximately 800 tickets were issued with about 50 per cent unknown here and March was expected to be about like January.

Eccles Says Recovery Awaiting Profits For Private Business

WASHINGTON, March 21.—(AP)—Chairman Marriner S. Eccles of the federal reserve board said today the principal impediment to recovery was the inability of private enterprise to obtain profits.

The bespectacled banking chief told the senate silver committee it was his opinion this condition was due in part to an excessive capacity for production, adding there could be only limited additional investment of private capital until buying power increases.
