The Alpha Delta Pi mothers' club will hold a rummage sale at 688 Olive street Saturday from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m.

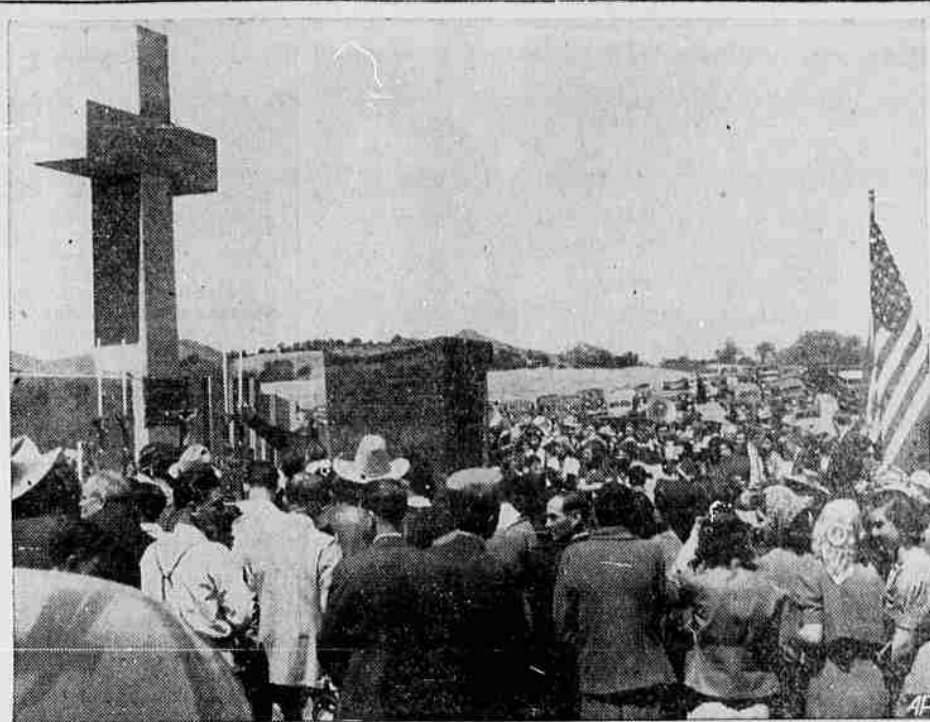
Roseburg Attorney Here—
