Michigan rolled up a total of 84 1/2 points, the highest it has ever scored, to completely dominate both track and field. Wisconsin, considered Michigan's closest rival, scored 45 5-12 points for second place and Indiana was third with 28 2-3.

Big Bill's mark in the discus—160 feet 10 1/2 inches—shattered the 23-year-old record set by Wisconsin's Arlie Muecks. He made it in the qualifying trials yesterday and couldn't beat it today.

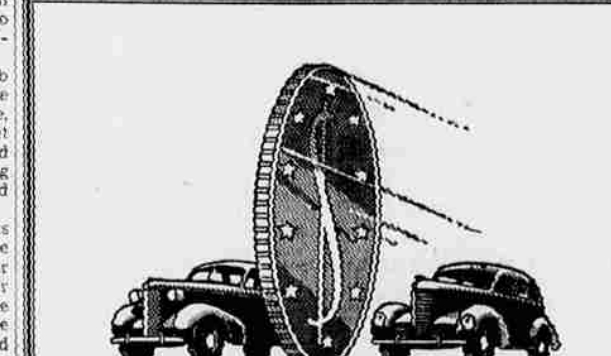
