An invitation for all former Washington residents to attend the jubilee celebrations being held in several cities in the state, has been delivered in Eugene by Elmer Keller, member of the executive committee for the events. The principal observance of the jubilee to the union will be held at Tacoma, July 20-23, Mr. Keller said. That city has been designated by the governor and the legislature as the official host city. Seattle, Ellensburg and Olympia are also having celebrations of their own. Liberals Celebrate Decision Against Hague

JERSEY CITY, N. J., June 13.—The American civil liberties union, tonight celebrated, with a mass meeting in hitherto "verboten" Journal square, the supreme court decision sustaining, with minor modifications, an injunction restraining Mayor Frank Hague and other Jersey City officials from interfering with civil liberties under the constitution. The court held that the Jersey City ordinances prohibiting the distribution of handbills and leaflets and regulating the manner in which public meetings might be held were wholly unconstitutional.
