Today's Recipes

EGGS can break the monotony of summer luncheon menus. And they don't always have to be hard boiled about it.

Eggs Baked With Spanish Sauce

(6 servings)

Six fresh eggs, 1 green pepper, chopped, 1 small onion chopped, 1 tablespoon chopped chives, 1 can condensed tomato soup, 1 1/2 teaspoons butter, salt, pepper, dash of cayenne.

Heat butter in frying pan. Add onions, green pepper and chives. Fry only until delicately brown. Add tomato soup and stir. Cook for 12 minutes over slow fire, stirring occasionally. Turn into baking dish.

Carefully break eggs over top of Spanish sauce. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and cayenne. Bake in hot oven (450 deg. F.) for about 10 minutes until eggs are set.

Served with French or Italian bread, this makes a very fine luncheon.

Deviled Eggs Baked

(6 servings)

Six hard-boiled eggs, 2 tablespoons cream and the following to taste: Salt, pepper, paprika, Worcestershire sauce, minced parsley and dry mustard.

Slice hard-boiled eggs in half, lengthwise. Remove yolks, mash and mix with cream. Work in all the other ingredients. Stuff whites with this deviled mixture. Place stuffed eggs in buttered shallow baking dish. Cover with light white sauce. Bake in modern oven (350 reg. F.) for about 15 minutes.
