

Accounting System Is Being Installed

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counting system in the road department in the past, but from this time on, after the proposed system is installed no bills will be paid until the auditor is satisfied they are O. K.

This new system, it is pointed out by county officials, will perhaps be the means of saving the county many thousands of dollars each year. A loosely kept system of accounts or no system at all is bound to result in leaks and a loss of money, even though there is no tendency on the part of employees of the county to be dishonest, it is pointed out.

The salary of the deputy to handle this work will be fixed by the county clerk, the order of the court says, and it will be paid out of the road funds in the same manner as other expenses are paid.

The order of the court, signed by all three members Wednesday, reads in part as follows:

"And it is further ordered that said county clerk be and he is

hereby authorized to employ any additional accounting or auditing services that he may consider necessary in establishing a proper auditing and cost accounting system for said Lane county road system and the purchase of necessary blanks, books, and equipment to install and make effective such system, such expenses to be paid out of said road funds.

"And it is further ordered that the said auditor for the Lane county road system shall be the accounting officer for said road system. All demands, accounts or claims against Lane county and payable out of road funds shall be presented to him with the necessary evidence in support thereof and he shall examine and audit the same, and if he finds such demands, accounts or claims correct, lawfully just and valid, and authorized by the board of county commissioners, endorse them as audited and approved with the date thereof, and until such claims have been so audited and approved, the county clerk shall not draw an order on the county treasurer for the payment thereof unless specifically authorized to do so by the county court.

"If a demand, claim or account and evidence in support thereof is

not sufficient to satisfy him as to its correctness, lawfulness, justice or validity, as above provided, he shall endorse the same as audited and rejected, with the date thereof and report the same to the county court with such explanation as he may deem necessary. He shall receive and preserve in his office all accounts, books, vouchers, documents and papers relating to the accounts, contracts, supplies and equipment of the road system of Lane county, its debts, revenues and other financial affairs. He shall establish and maintain such an accounting system for said road system, for the various districts thereof, and the various departments thereof, as shall secure accuracy, economy, and protection of the county's interests, and shall require records and reports to be made to him by county road system employees on such forms and in such manner as will enable him to establish and maintain such system.

"The system herein provided for shall become effective as soon as the same may be installed and established."

Round Table Hears Science Discussion

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Dr. Moore, that this attitude of the totalitarian governments will bring about their destruction. They are laying all stress on what he calls "gadgets," the inventions which are the mere by-products of the great principles which result alone from free and unhampered scientific thought.

Already, he says, the Germans have felt the lack of adequately prepared technicians to grapple with some of the problems which the war has already produced. Thus the seizure of Polish coal mines to compensate for Saar coal mines destroyed by French bombardment will not immediately result in the replacement of gasoline distilled from coal because the Polish coal is essentially different, requiring different applications of basic principles which present day German technicians lack.

In particular, Dr. Moore sees the militarized "youth movements" of the totalitarian states, destroying all physical and mental fitness of young people for an approach to science. The pupils often are physically exhausted by the time they reach the schools. Their mental attitudes are set against the open inquiry for truth which scientific work must have.

All this led the Knights of the Round Table to a fust as to what is "science." Dr. Moore denies that it can be adequately defined merely as a method or an attitude. It is a search for truth, itself, he says, based strange as it may seem, on a religious belief that there is order in nature everywhere.

Should pure scientists be required to make more practical application of their findings? Dr. Moore says positively not. That's for the gadgeteers, the inventors, the fellows who juggle a few known principles around till they get a thimblebob that clicks. For the advancement of the race, Dr. Moore contends the scientist must be left absolutely free to pursue truth.

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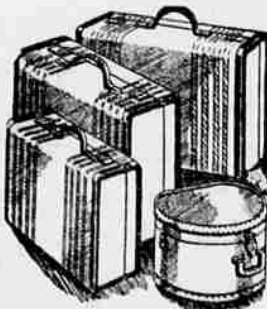
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
