

Students Find Site Of Camp

NEWBERG, Feb. 13.—(P)—Drawing on records of the Oregon historical society and the memory of Frank Osborn, Champoe pioneer, a group of Pacific college students has found the site of a Northwest fur company hunting camp, believed the second white settlement in the state.

The students found the bowl of a clay pipe, a rusted iron ax head, broken crockery and hand-made nails.

The rusty records disclosed the hunting camp had been located about two miles downstream from the present site of Newberg on the eastern county side of the Willamette river. It had been established to obtain venison and other game.

Osborn remembered helping set down an old log cabin there years ago. The camp was established in 1813.

Mississippi Ice Dam Breaks Without Damage

CINCINNATI, O., Feb. 13.—(AP)—A 25-mile ice gorge at dam 39 on the Ohio river, 65 miles west of Cincinnati, broke today, piling up 15 feet onto the Lock-Esplanade and nearby Ohio river levee line.

The river rose two feet within 10 minutes, then started to recede.

Latvian, Estonian Unrest Cheers Finns

HELSINKI, Feb. 13.—(P)—Finnish leaders showed intense interest in reports reaching Helsinki today stating that Latvia and Estonia were growing restive under their new military agreements with Soviet Russia and possibly were approaching a crisis in their relations with Moscow.

The Finns were watching particularly military developments across the Gulf of Finland. Gen. Berkins, chief of the Latvian army, was reported to have gone to Estonia to negotiate with General Johan Laidoner, commander-in-chief of the Estonian army, in connection with cooperation to strengthen the national defenses of the two states.

Eugenean's Offer To Give Californians Rain Is Spurned

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Feb. 13.—(P)—"But Mr. Watson, a rain-maker came to San Diego in 1916, and the results were disastrous. We had great floods causing a considerable loss of life and a great amount of property damage."
