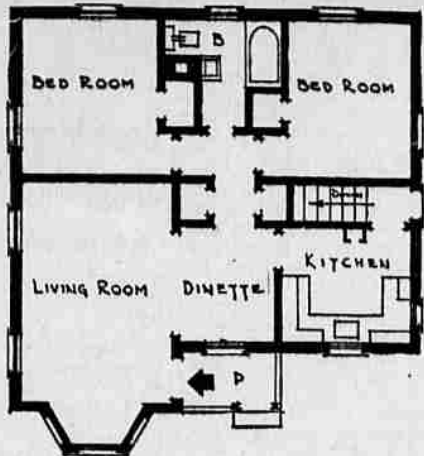


For The Medium-Income Budget



FLOOR PLAN

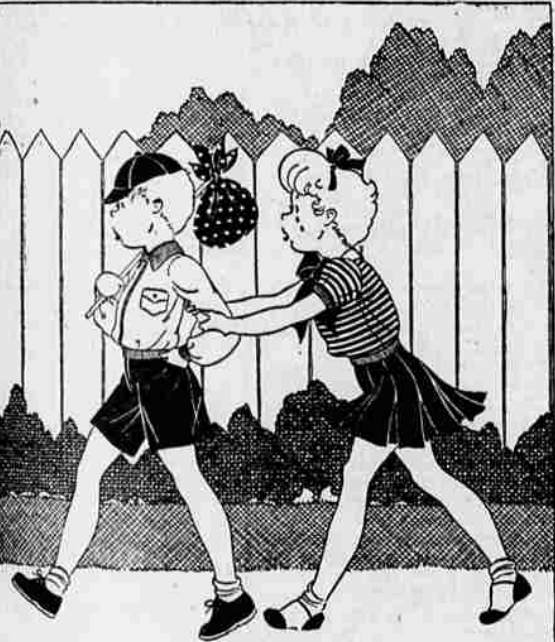

Hatay's Pictorials Were Republic's Last Issue

THERE will be no more "Hatay Devleti" stamps. The little, two-year-old republic, originally carved out of Syria, shown on the map stamp above, became part of Turkey as the price France paid for the promise of Turkish assistance in the Near East. The 1939 pictorial series of four designs and 13 values, and a postage due set of four values, comprise the principal philatelic issues of the short-lived republic. The first Hatay stamps were Syrian and Turkish overprints. The end of the republic is noted, philatellically, by overprints of a Turkish issue of 1939. Hatay became independent under a treaty between France and Turkey in 1937. Turkey formally annexed the 3000-square mile nation of 250,000 people on July 23, 1939. Citizens were permitted to choose Syrian, Lebanese or Turkish citizenship. Those rejecting Turkey will be given 18 months to leave the area.



THE United States marks the 50th anniversary of the Pan American Union with a commemorative 3-cent stamp of the design, above, released on April 14 at Washington, D. C. The stamp pictures the Three Graces, from Botticelli's painting, "Spring," and symbolizes the good will of North, Central and South American republics. Although the Pan American Union is only a half century old, the foundations of inter-American accord were laid by Simon Bolivar in the first Congress of American States in 1826. Subsequent meetings were held during the 19th century, but the first definite steps toward preservation of peace in the western hemisphere and improvement of commercial relations were made at the 1890 meeting at Washington. Twenty-one republics are now included in the Union, and its effectiveness has been proved in peaceful settlement of several major disputes.
