

Residence of C. F. Wright Chosen As Register-Guard Home of the Week

Home Embodies New Features

U-Shaped Kitchen Planned By Owners

Pleasant chimes greet the visitor as he pushes the door bell of the new home of the C. F. Wrights at 2343 Olive street which is this week's Register-Guard "Home of the Week." The house was completed last October. From the entrance hall one looks into the living room which is finished in dusty peach plaster and with furniture to match. A large mirror over the fireplace showed two sides of lovely matching bouquets of apple blossoms.

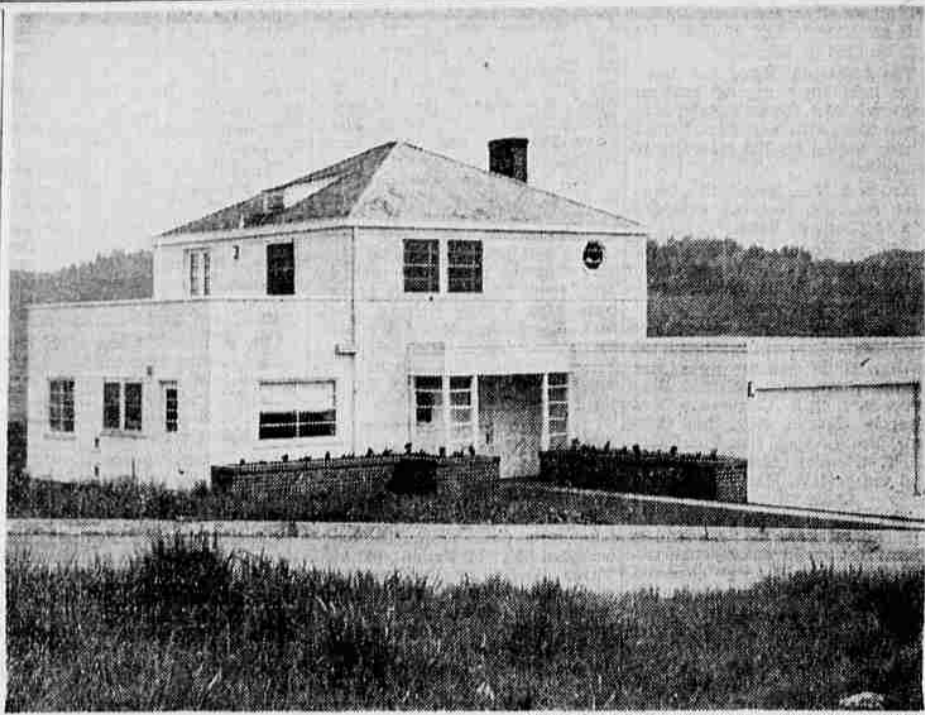
This room has special casement curtains instead of Venetian blinds; these can be pulled clear of the windows to give a full view of the scenery and the landscaped terrace in the back.

The dining room is to the left and it has two arched niches in the corners which hold pottery vases of a delicate blue. Mrs. Wright confessed that after she had searched San Francisco for the right color, she found these in Eugene's green stamp department.

Cheerful Kitchen
The kitchen and utility room room with a breakfast bar are cheerfully finished in red and white, with built-in corner cupboards which keep everything in neat order. The U-kitchen was planned by the Wrights and has large cooler drawers built in the corners which will hold a box of fruit at a time if necessary. Mrs. Wright says this is very handy. She also likes the idea of a concealed garbage can. It is under the back porch.

The house is furnished with multi-breaker switch connections which are much handier than the old fuse type connections.

All the doors downstairs are plank and perfectly plain which Mrs. Wright says are a great aid in dusting. The place is heated by

all and the heat registers are all built in the walls.
The staircase to the right of the entrance hall has hand-made iron grill work hand rail which is the first piece of its kind turned out by Mr. Crocker of Crocker's Art-craft shop, 50-13th Avenue west. This is not completed in the grill work between the hall and living room which holds small ivy pots.
The nursery and two large bedrooms are on the second floor. The main bedroom opens through French doors onto the large sun-deck to be seen in the picture. This bedroom also has two large closets and the whole floor upstairs is carpeted in blue.
The bathroom is finished in three shades of blue and trimmed in chromium stripping between the shades. At the foot of the bathtub is a handy modernistic cabinet which holds things needed and has a laundry drawer. An electric heater is built-in here also for special occasions.
The house is completely modern with brass and ivory hardware, and gold and cream light fixtures.
The original plan for the home was adopted from a magazine by the Wrights and John E. Milligan, who was the contractor and builder.

Advice Given On Spring Roof Repairs

When repairing composition roofs, good use may be made of a liquid asbestos roof coating. First, the roof should be checked over for nails that have become loosened or pulled up by the hot sun or frost. These should be driven back into place thoroughly. After the surface is brushed clean, all breaks in the old roofing as well as loose seams, cracks and apertures around nails whose heads are rusted off should be filled with the roof coating.
The coating should be spread for two or three inches beyond the break itself. A strip of muslin, large enough to cover, is then pressed down firmly into the coating so that no tag ends show.
Over this is poured enough coating to thoroughly cover the fabric and an additional inch beyond the edges. The coating should also be applied around flashings after they have been nailed down fast to prevent leaks. The same type of treatment may be applied to badly rusted gutters.

Building Boom May Set 12-Year Record

WASHINGTON, April 20—(AP)—New evidence of a coming home-building boom which might set a 12-year record was reported today by Stewart McDonald, federal housing administrator.
He said all records for FHA home financing were broken during the week ended April 13, for the fourth successive week, as construction was started on 3,700 new units under FHA inspection.
For the first time, too, applications for FHA mortgage insurance on new homes exceeded 5,000 breaking past records for the seventh successive week, while mortgages selected for appraisal reached a peak of 6,647, amounting to \$29,978,000.
Secretary Perkins reported that permit valuations for new residential construction totaled one-third greater in 1933 than in the preceding year. The dollar volume of residential construction for which permits were issued was \$1,169,000,000, she said, higher than for any other year since 1929.

Proper Size Rugs Add To Tone Of Room

One of the sure harbingers of Spring, traditional home refurbishing time, is the appearance of new developments and new styles in rugs and carpets. Generally acknowledged by decorators to be the foundation, the focal point of a room, increasing attention is being paid these days to the rug, and to the many innovations recently introduced by America's rug manufacturers.

Size and Style Now Equal
to have a far-reaching effect on to have a far-reaching effect on America's carpeting habits. For years now size has been almost an after-thought when buying a new rug, secondary to the chief requisites of style and pattern. But now size is accorded equal footing with those other important considerations. Manufacturers are turning out "Tailor-Made" rugs, made in a wide enough range of sizes to fit—and fit correctly—any room, regardless of dimensions. This new turn has the solid backing of decorative experts. One of their most ironclad decrees is "Good decoration starts with a rug that fits." All of them agree that a right size rug will make a room larger, better balanced, more homelike.

Allow 6 to 12 Inches
As an authority recently put it, "A too-small rug is like a too-small suit. Both detract immeasurably from the appearance of the wearer, in one case a room, in the other a man. No room can possibly hope to be smartly turned out, to achieve that desirable decorative 'tone' or atmosphere, unless it has a correct fitting rug on the floor."

Powderpost Beetles
When wooden columns on porches are infested by powderpost beetles they should be replaced, either completely or in part, depending on the extent of

the damage. Other woodwork in the neighborhood should be examined. If only a few holes are found, kerosene should be dropped into them with a match. If new columns are necessary, they may be installed from funds obtained from special lending institutions under the Modernization Credit Plan of the Federal Housing Administration.
