Sealed proposals for the furnishing of all materials, labor and supervision required for the complete erection of an extension to the municipal steam power plant building, and for the erection of a fuel storage bin, will be received at the Office of the Engineer and Water Board in Eugene, Oregon, up to seven-thirty o'clock p. m. of Monday, the 19th day of August 1940, at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read. Separate bids will be considered as follows:

Contract Section "D":
1. The erection of the power plant extension.
2. The erection of a fuel storage bin.
3. The erection of a fuel storage bin, Alternate Design "B".
4. Combined bids 1 and 2 or 1 and 3.

All work is to be done in accordance with the specifications on file at the office of the Engineer and Water Board.

Qualified prospective bidders may obtain a copy of said plans and specifications, on application, on deposit of Ten Dollars (\$10.00). Said deposit will be returned in full to any depositor who returns said plans and specifications in good condition at least five days (5) prior to the date of receiving bids.

Each bidder must furnish a bond in a sum equal to not less than five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid, shall be in conformity with the Oregon law, the Eugene Water Board has adopted a pre-qualification statement form which shall be properly completed and executed by the prospective bidder and approved by the Eugene Water Board, before any statement or proposal form can be supplied the bidder. The required pre-qualification forms will be furnished by the Eugene Water Board.

Each bidder, upon application therefor, Any bid submitted by a bidder who has not qualified under Oregon laws will be returned unopened.

It is the right of the City of Eugene to reject any or all bids, to waive technicalities and irregularities, and to accept any combination of bids, if it deems such action to be for the best interests of the City of Eugene.
