

War's Industries Begin Work on Defense Program

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—(U.P.)—The nation's industries, large and small, are beginning to turn their hands to the production of war materials. The government is expected to receive them in the near future.

Here are some of the principal "peace to war" conversions that the industries are being asked to perform:

Manufacturers of agricultural implements to produce gun carriages and combat wagons.

Mining machine manufacturers to turn out combat tanks.

Producers of lathes for turning out wooden ducks for shooting galleries to make lathes for army shoes.

Church pipe organ manufacturers to make the wooden framework for army saddles.

Makers of flat bed printing presses to turn out recoil mechanisms for 155 millimeter howitzers.

Manufacturers of cash registers

and adding machines to produce bomb fuses.

Parking meter manufacturers to make bomb mechanisms.

Makers of automatic lead pencils to manufacture ammunition parts.

Makers of toy soldiers and miniature trains to produce mesh gears and canteens.

Vacuum cleaner manufacturers to produce gas masks.

Makers of ladies' underwear to manufacture mosquito netting for troops in the field.
