

### 40 Man Wins Job Alaska University

Henry Eugene Stevens, who received his degree of doctor of education from the University of Oregon in June, has just received his appointment as head of the department of education at the University of Alaska, it is announced by J. R. Jewell, dean of education here.

Stevens will begin offering education courses at the opening of the winter semester, starting in Fairbanks. He will have the responsibility of planning and putting into execution of the school of education as well as the teachers' college for the state teachers of all levels, primary as well as secondary, and the student body of the University.

University of Alaska is already being materially augmented by the attendance of the sons and daughters of the military men who are being stationed at Fairbanks, as the federal government gets under way the construction of the next to largest airport in the United States, and as Fairbanks is being made the military center for the defense of all the western part of this hemisphere.

Dr. Stevens was born in Portland, and taught in Portland for several years before coming to the University of Oregon for his doctorate.

### Worse Than Coventry, Is Brag Of Germans

BERLIN, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Fervid fires and explosions, even greater than those that devastated Coventry a week ago, were left raging in Birmingham, Britain's second city, by night-long relays of fighting planes which dropped more than 1,000,000 pounds of bombs, the high command said today.

Five hundred planes dumped bombs, some of them of the greatest size, hour by hour on the armament and supply industries of Birmingham, informed military sources said.

The high command's communique reported that London, Liverpool, Southampton and other ports and airfields came in for additional attacks.

### Parking Of Cars On Roadway Near Industrial Area Out

Parking of cars on the surfacing or on the shoulders of Garfield street between the Oregon Electric railway track and the end of Second avenue has been prohibited by the county court. An order to that effect was made by the court Wednesday, following complaints that so many cars have been parked on both sides of the street (which is a county road) that it has been very difficult for long loads of poles and other material to turn from or to the street. This condition has caused other hazards, the court was told.

Employees of several industrial plants, including the new plywood mill, have used the street as a parking place for their cars, the court was told. County Judge Clinton Hurd suggests that the mills provide parking space for the cars of employees.

### Mr. Theodore Bear, Inventor Of Teddy, Dies In Chicago

CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Theodore Bear, 78, who introduced the teddy bear and gave it his own name, died yesterday at his home.

The manufacturer of toy bears and children's apparel in Chicago for 35 years was a member of the firm of Bear brothers, originally established in Cincinnati.

Bear's only son, Walter, said his father introduced the toy about 1905 and gave it the name and trademark he had popularized on earlier products, baby coaches and clothing. The toy bear bore a tag with the body of a bear and the portrait of Bear as the face. Across the body was Bear's signature and the phrase, "The Original Teddy."

### American Sent Back To Station In France

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Relations between the United States and France entered an apparently new phase today, coincident with the increasing reports that Marshal Henri Petain was showing a disposition to go slow in collaborating with the axis powers.

First tangible sign of a possible change was the fact that Robert D. Murphy, a veteran of 10 years' diplomatic service in France before and during the war, was ordered back to Vichy to take up the duties of charge d'affaires. Murphy, former counsellor at the Paris embassy, has been in this country for several months.

### Midnight Fire Burns Baker Printing Plant

BAKER, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Fire last midnight destroyed the plant of the Ryder Brothers Printing Co., the largest printing and wholesale stationery concern in eastern Oregon, and swept the Geddes and Smith Peter Grocery. Loss was estimated at \$80,000.

Firemen, in a three-hour battle with new pumper equipment, saved frame structures on either side of the blackened two-story stone building, but some water damage was suffered by a Safeway store. The fire was believed to have started in the basement, near the building's heating plant.

BUDAPEST, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Hungarian sources said today that Rumania's adherence to the axis would be signed Friday when Rumanian Premier Gen. Ion Antonescu visits Berlin.

### Lane Forest Patrol Tax For 1941 Fixed

The state tax for fire patrol in Lane county forest in 1941 will be a trifle higher in the western part of the county and about the same as this year in the eastern portion, according to word received by Walter D. Billard, county clerk, from the state board of forestry at Salem.

The tax in the western forests of Lane will be 4.5 cents an acre and that in the eastern part, 2.8 cents an acre, the clerk was informed.

This tax is assessed against all privately owned timber lands in the county and is collected at the time other property tax is due.

MT. ANGEL, Nov. 21.—(AP)—The East Side commercial club of Portland has appointed a committee to promote Oregon's infant flax industry, growers said today.

The committee will work with growers and business men of Mt. Angel. Eugene, Springfield and Canby. E. J. Griffith, state WPA administrator, will cooperate.

### Notice Is Expected From Bonneville People

Ten-day notice to Bonneville authorities that Eugene is ready to use the Columbia river power will be given early next week, as soon as the city's line to the Bonneville sub-station is completed, J. W. McArthur, superintendent of the water board, announced Wednesday. The crews have been kept busy repairing wire service in private residences thus delaying work on the extension.

Power will be shut off in the Elmira district Friday and Saturday from 12:05 to 1 p. m., while work is being done on this extension, Mr. McArthur said, and if necessary for a few days early next week at the same time. There will be no shut-off on either Thanksgiving or Sunday, however.

The Eugene water board plans to purchase a block of Bonneville power this winter for standby purposes until the 7500-kilowatt steam plant is completed.
