CANAL ZONE postal officials are issuing a final warning to collectors that all stocks of the 1939 airmail and postage commemoratives will be destroyed Feb. 28. The stamp above, showing a transport plane above Sosa Hill, is one of six airmails, marking the 10th anniversary of airmail service and the 25th anniversary of the opening of the Panama Canal.

The postage series of 16 values shows views of the canal during and after construction. This group was placed on first-day sale Aug. 15, 1939.

Orders should be addressed to the Canal Zone Philatelic Agency, in care of the postmaster at Balboa Heights, C. Z., and should be accompanied by money order covering cost of stamps and return postage.

SPECIAL U. S. commemoratives honoring Vermont and Indiana are on the Postoffice Department's tentative schedule for 1941 release.
