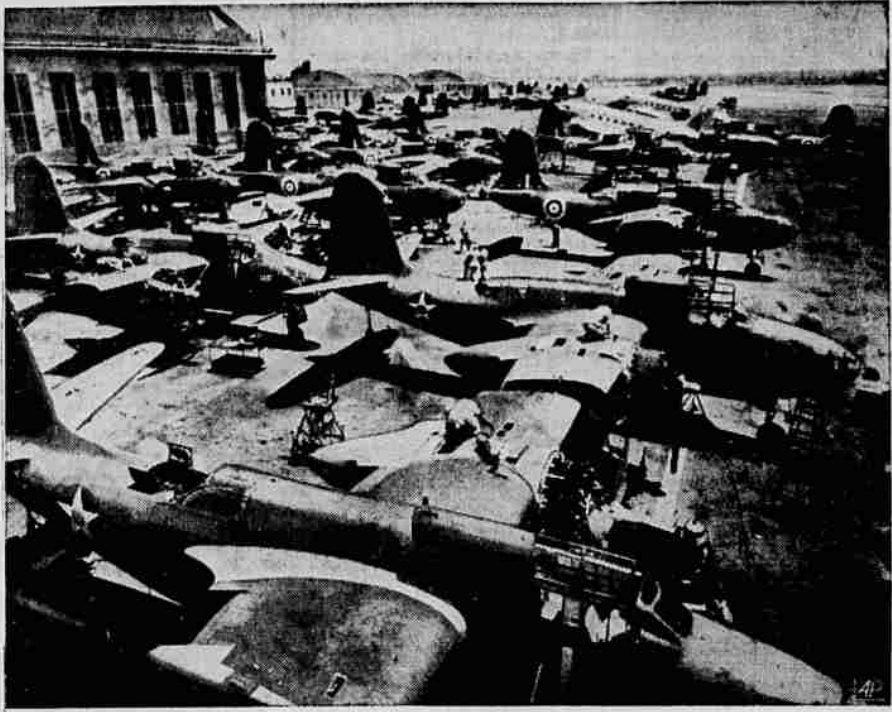

Second Half License Will Be Issued
