

July 10 Deadline For Soap Box Racer Entries To Register

Eugene's young Peter De Paolos and Barney Oldfields who will compete in the Silva Chevrolet-Register-Guard Soap Box derby here July 12 and 19 must register official entry blanks at the Silva company not later than July 10.

Harry Fern, Silva sales manager who is in charge of the event, announced Tuesday that official entry blanks have arrived and that all of the some 50 boys who have entered are to come to the Silva company, accompanied by a parent or guardian, and register for the race.

Trials for the "main event" will be held on the Charnelton street hill Saturday, July 12, a week prior to the championships which

will give the youthful pilots a chance to remove the "bottle-necks" from their gasless buggies.

The Soap Box derby is an annual National event sponsored by the Chevrolet company and offering National winners many choice awards. The finals will be held in Akron, Ohio. Local winners will win a trip to Portland. All expenses paid. And the state champion will be given a jaunt to Akron.

RUSSIA says German invasion checked at two key points in Nazi drive toward Moscow and Ukraine, admit loss of Lwow; Stockholm hears Latvian capital, Riga, captured by Germans; France moves nearer 10-day-old struggle. Vichy government has "no objection" to French volunteers fighting alongside Germans.

GERMANS report driving within sight of Smolensk, 250 miles from Moscow, through Lithuania and Latvia nearer Leningrad, and into Ukraine through Lwow, leaving behind trapped and dismembered Russian armies; Leningrad fortified with conscript labor; Russians admit withdrawal but say Nazi push is slowed by fierce fighting.

BRITISH industrial attack Cologne and industrial Westphalia area of western Germany after daylight stabs at Kiel, Sylt; Nazis hit back at western England and South Wales.

NAVY SECRETARY KNOX urge use of U. S. navy to deal Hitler "a smashing blow"; stirs speculation that important change in policy toward Nazi sea activities may be in offing.

The municipal band will be at the stadium Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights to play several numbers before and during the games, Mr. Fisher announced.

Arrangements have been made with the University of Oregon physical education officials for the use of the swimming pool and shower facilities in the men's gym by the soldiers during the week. It is planned to have the pool ready each afternoon soon after the units arrive and to limit use of the pool to from ten to 20 minutes for each group of men. Showers at the civic stadium will be made available for the officers, according to Dr. J. F. Cramer, speaking for the school board.

Tentative plans have been made to admit the soldiers either free of charge or at a small nominal rate to the local theaters during the week, and the committee is also working on plans to hold the regular Thursday night wrestling matches at the civic stadium instead of the fairgrounds.

Mrs. C. F. Gray of the Military Service Mothers' club has been contacted in regard to hospitality for the soldiers and has pledged the support of her group.

Further announcements will be made by the recreation committee following the arrival here Thursday afternoon of a "rail head" group of officers and men to make plans for the visit of the soldiers here.

TROOPS MOVE SOON

FORT LEWIS, July 1.—A great northward trek of 40,000 officers and men of the 9th army corps, weary from six weeks of war maneuvers in central California, started today with the scheduled departure of six troop trains from King City, Calif.

Exact departure time of the troop trains were not disclosed by transportation officers at Fort Lewis but their arrival time was given as Thursday morning, from 5:30 to 9:30 a. m.

Motor convoys will start north tomorrow morning, bivouacking at Modesto, Calif., the first night. The convoys will not begin arriving at Fort Lewis until July 7.

sung by the entire chorus and will include "Onward Ye Peoples" by Sibelius, "Battle Hymn of the Republic," and "Star Spangled Banner" by the entire cast and the audience.

The seated chorus, which includes members of the Eugene Gleemen and the Women's choral group, will sing two numbers alone, "Oregon, My Oregon" during the coronation prelude, and "Hail Mighty Chief" during the Declaration of Independence scene.

Solo work in the pageant this year will be limited to the traditional "Pale Moon" solo by Sacajawea in the Lewis and Clark scene, Tschalkowsky's "Pillgrim's Song" in the creation episode, and "Ohs usannah" by a small boy in the pioneer episode.

The Mormons will give a "repeat" performance of their hymn "Come, Come Ye Saints" in the pioneer episode and a group of men will sing two French-Canadian songs "En Roulant" and "Tenaouch Tenauch" in the Fort Vancouver scene.

Two smaller men's choruses, a women's chorus and a group of Eugene high school members of the a cappella choir will also be featured. The students are to sing "Ballad for Americans" in the melting pot scene, while the women will sing "Prayer" in accompaniment to the Indian ceremonial "dance for clear weather" in the Indian episode.

One of the men's choruses is to sing "Blow Boys Blow" in the Ship Columbia scene while the second group will sing "Auld Lang Syne," "Bonnie Dundee" and "Bendemeer's Stream" in the Fort Vancouver scene.

While a few numbers familiar to pageant audiences have been omitted in this year's program, there will actually be more singing for the chorus and small groups than in any previous pageant, Mr. Griffith declared, and many new songs will be introduced to carry out the "freedom" theme.

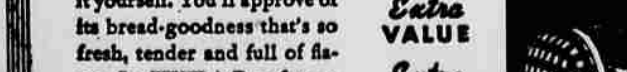
