Hal Young, for several years professor of voice at the University of Oregon school of music, has resigned his position with the institution and, Tuesday, announced he will be a partner with George F. Schaefer in operating the Eugene Recreation center.

Mr. Young will be on hand at Recreation, Tuesday evening, to greet friends in his new business venture.

"It was a big decision to make to give up my work in the school of music, but the opportunity to go in business for myself was too great to pass by," Mr. Young said.

This fall marked the sixth year for Mr. Young at the school of music. Several years preceding his coming here to make his home he had been in Eugene for a year with his music work. For some time he has been director also for the First Christian church choir

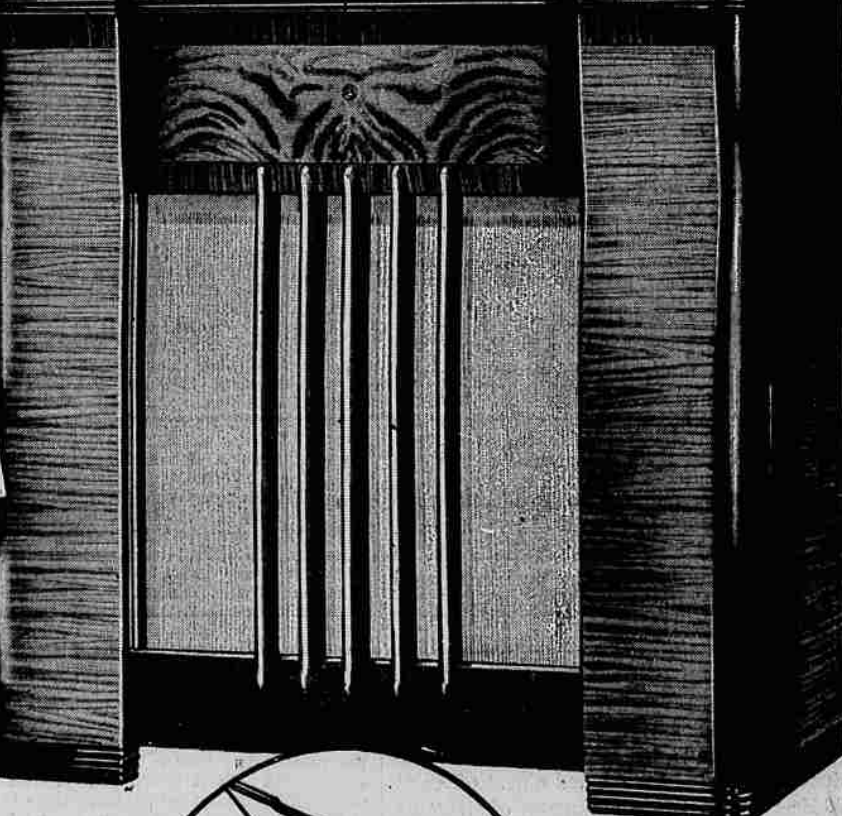
