Since he made his American debut in 1887, as a child of ten, Hofmann has risen to the pinnacle of his craft. For the past 54 years he has thrilled music lovers the world over and critics and audiences hail him as an artist who performs each year the astonishing feat of surpassing himself.

Mr. Hofmann made his last Eugene appearance in 1935 and there has been a constant demand for a return engagement since that memorable concert. Tickets will be placed on sale for the January 7 recital on Monday, December 29, at the A.S.U.O. ticket office in McArthur court.
