### DePaul Demons Defeat Wandering Oregon Basketball Team, 27-23

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—(AP)—After most of the way, DePaul's Paul Jackson led the team in the last two minutes of the touring Oregon game, 27-23, in the Chicago stadium. It was the first game of a series between the two teams since the 1937-38 season. Jackson scored 18 points, including the winning basket in the second quarter.

The Blue Demons took a 25-23 lead after 18 minutes of the second half and counted two more points on Bernie Wexler's field goal to win the game. Oregon scored twice taking the ball back on consecutive free-throw chances.

DePaul's Paul Jackson paced all efforts for the evening, scoring 18 baskets and one free throw to give him a one-point margin over Oregon's scoring star, Cominsky, who finished up with 16 baskets and four charity shots.

The score was tied eight times in the course of the game. Jackson's traveling Webfoots ahead 1-0 before Cominsky sparked Oregon to a 5 to 5 tie.

Oregon's 17 to 13 lead at half time was widest margin enjoyed by the team until the end of the game, when the same four-point margin was regained.

Final totals proved short shots by Oregon, with 61 out of 88 shots near the basket, 41 of DePaul's 61 listed on the way.

## Neale Named Top Netman

### Portland Flash Heads Northwest Rankings

HOQUIAM, Wash., Dec. 20.—(AP)—Workhorse Emery Neale of Portland, the Stanford university tennis flash who lost only two matches in six gruelling Pacific Northwest tournaments last summer, today held top ranking in the Pacific Northwest Lawn Tennis Association's 1941 men's singles listings.

The association also released women's, junior, boys' and girls' singles rankings through its president, Harry S. Knox of Hoquiam.

The lanky, taciturn Neale started his Northwest campaign last summer by winning the Portland city tourney; the Pacific Northwest sectional at Portland; the Oregon State at Portland; and the Washington State at Seattle.

The week before the latter tourney he was runner-up to Nick Carter of San Francisco in the Pacific Northwest at Tacoma.

And the week after the Washington State meet here, he finally collapsed in the semi-final of the Western Canadian tournament at Vancouver, B. C., and lost to Harold Wagner, of San Francisco, a former Washington State champion.
