Germans Claim U. S. Carrier Damaged

Eagle, and the damaging of the British aircraft carrier Furious, the Wasp, and three British cruisers. Nine merchant ships were sunk and six damaged, according to the axis claim.

The British admiralty previously acknowledged the sinking of the 24-year-old aircraft carrier Eagle and claimed the sinking of one axis U-boat in the Mediterranean, but made no further comment on the axis claims.

The Wasp, a 14,700 ton carrier with a capacity of 72 to 84 planes, last spring ran the Mediterranean gauntlet and succeeded in delivering reinforcements of fighter planes to besieged Malta.

The carriers Wasp and Furious, the latter a 22,450 ton vessel with a normal complement of 748 officers and men and 33 planes, were damaged in the same action in which the Eagle was sunk, according to the German high command.

The Wasp was damaged and set afire after six direct bomb hits by attacking axis planes, while it was trying to reach Malta, the Germans claimed.

The normal complement of the three-year-old Wasp is 1800 officers and men, including flying personnel.

The communicate said that, as result of the battering axis U-boat and submarine attacks, most of the ships of the convoy had dispersed and were "in retreat westward," trying to reach Gibraltar.

Some of the ships, however, were trying to reach Malta, it was stated.

"Fighting still continues and more great successes can be expected," the German radio said, quoting the communicate.

The Furious, a British carrier, was said by the Germans to have been damaged heavily and was reported to have reached Gibraltar.

Pulling out of line is involved in 16 per cent of motor fatalities.

(Pacific War Time)

NEW YORK, Aug. 14.—(Wide World)—India's future will be examined informally over CBS Saturday in a round-robin discussion around a dinner table in New York.

The program, regular "People's Platform" beginning at 4 p. m., will bring to the microphone Anup Singh, a Hindu follower of Gandhi; Muddassir Ali Shanshe, a Moslem; Sir Norman Angell, winner of the 1933 Nobel peace prize, and Lyman Bryson, CBS education director.

Britain's policy in India, Gandhi's arrest and India's course in the war will be discussed by the four after they have concluded dinner, the procedure in this novel program.

A summary of the Solomon Islands invasion will be presented by Brigadier General Thomas Holcombe, U. S. marine corps commandant, in a March of Time broadcast from Washington over NBC at 7:30 tonight. Also scheduled for the program is a pickup of Major General Mark W. Clark, commanding general of American ground forces in Great Britain.

Scotland's role in the war will be highlighted Sunday over NBC at 2:30 in the fourth "Britain to America" broadcast. Will Fyffe, vaudeville comedian, and Dr. James Hutchison Cockburn, ex-moderator of the Church of Scotland and a World War I chaplain, will be on the program.
