Fund Set up to Help Students in Service

University alumni now in the armed forces may return after the war to complete their education by means of scholarships provided by war bonds donated by campus living groups. Six fraternities have already pledged themselves to purchase bonds periodically and

donate them to the service scholarship fund, and others are expected to make similar pledges.

Delta Upsilon and Sigma Chi fraternities have pledged to give a bond every month, while Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Alpha Mu, and Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternities will swell the scholarship fund with a bond every term. Oglesby Young of Portland, service scholarship fund chairman, said that other campus living houses are now being con-

tacted and will probably also pledge bond donations.

FBI Finds No Sabotage In Tanker Sinking
