CHOPPED BEET AND PEAS

4 tablespoons shortening

4 tablespoons sugar

1/2 teaspoon white pepper

2 cups milk

1/2 cup chopped beets, shredded

1 can Pictsweet Peas

Heat shortening and blend with sugar and pepper, adding milk gradually, stirring constantly until mixture is smooth and thickened. Add chopped beets and heat thoroughly. Meanwhile, heat peas in saucepan; drain, and add to beets.

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
