Dairymen Plan Statewide Action

er-distributors and 55 to producers who sell through creameries was not correct. Figures produced by Mr. Mapes show that 70 percent of the total comes from distributors who market through creameries.

Many speeches were made denouncing OPA policy which requires distributors to show a definite money loss or a serious shortage of supply before adjusting retail prices.

"If health standards are to be maintained, prices must begin at the cowbarn," it was pointed out. "If we wait till dairymen are forced to sell their cows and retire from business, there won't be any milk to regulate."

"Are these college professors in OPA serving at a loss?" demanded one producer. "I'd like to know how they get any right to lecture us on our patriotic duty to run dairies at a loss of \$300 per month."

"Get the public back of us," said another speaker. "We can't fight this fight alone. The federal government is too big for us. Let the mothers know that their children may not get milk and the women will tear into these bureaucrats."

Reports were received from Astoria, The Dalles, Bend, Salem and many other areas where similar uprisings are taking place.

THE DALES, Jan. 30.—(P.) Residents here today faced the possibility of being without milk after Feb. 15 as the result of an agreement by local dairies to suspend operations unless the OPA raises by two cents the present ceiling price of 13 cents a quart.
