WPA Tools, Etc., Converted to War Use

WASHINGTON, Feb. 6.—(U.P.)—More than \$20,000,000 worth of machinery, tools, office furniture, supplies and other equipment of the work projects administration is being converted to war use, George H. Field, deputy commissioner of the work projects administration said today.

Large quantities of WPA road building equipment are being used by the public roads administration in construction of the Alaska highway. Other WPA equipment has been transferred for use in construction of the inter-American highway.

Trucks, tools, and other equipment has been turned over to the army, the navy and other war agencies, Field said.

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tion program that would restore the fisheries in a few years. There is considerable doubt, however, that the legislature would give the fish commission the additional powers, since there is a bitter factional fight involved. Most packers are against it.

Ultimate Goal Distant

The ultimate goal is the establishment of a three-state commission, embracing Washington, Oregon and Idaho, which would have authority to carry on conservation. This, however, is far in the future, as it is believed forbidden by the Oregon constitution, and also would require congressional action.

The house ways and means committee recommended passage of Governor Snell's bill to set up a 15-man post-war planning committee, but his request for a \$25,000 appropriation was cut to \$10,000. The senate industries committee recommended passage of a bill to increase the industrial accident commission's reserve fund from \$500,000 to \$4,500,000.
