PORTLAND, Feb. 20 — (AP) — Post-war air commerce will make

Isolation impossible, Dr. Victor P. Morris, dean of the University of Oregon school of business administration, said here today.

He told City club members that problems of world peace will not be settled all at once at the end of the war but little by little over a period of years.

No set of boundary lines can be conceived that will take care of equal access to raw materials, he said. This can be achieved only by organizing trade on a larger and freer scale than formerly, he asserted, pointing to the need of a world organization to handle such problems.

FUNERAL SERVICE SET

Charles Boston Campbell died in Eugene Feb. 19. He was born August 24, 1871, in Lincoln, Neb.
