Greenwich Village Fun At The Heilig

"A Night to Remember," now at the Heilig theater, finds both Loretta Young and Brian Aherne, its co-stars, in unaccustomed roles.

Aherne, usually seen in dramatic parts, here tables light comedy and proves a find. Miss Young, usually glamorous in dress and setting, is this time the wife of a struggling writer and lives in a tiny Greenwich Village apartment. The story concerns efforts of the couple to solve a murder in their rooms, also the mysterious conduct of other tenants in the building.

The names of Jeff Donnell and Lee Patrick in the cast will confuse some. Both are young women. Jeff, in a brief but telling role, turns on hysterics for her third consecutive picture—and well.

To heighten spookiness, the film features some of the lowest-key lighting in years. At times the set was so dark it was considered wise to put guide lights on the offstage floor at places where persons might stumble.

Sidney Toler, cast as a canny detective and usually a "one take" actor, excusably spoiled a couple of rehearsals the first morning. He slipped into the dialect of another detective he plays, Charlie Chan.

The second feature is "Laugh Your Blues Away" with Jinx Falkenburg and Bert "Mad Russian" Gordon.

'Casablanca' Due McDonald Thursday

La Medina, the mysterious vice-infested section of Casablanca, will soon be as familiar to American picture audiences as the Casba, the criminal quarter of Algiers, made famous in the picture, "Algiers."

For La Medina figures importantly in "Casablanca," the new Warner Bros. film, starring Humphrey Bogart, Ingrid Bergman and Paul Henreid, which opens at the McDonald theater on Thursday.

That section was recreated on the screen under the technical supervision of Robert Eisner, French army officer, who escaped the Nazi claw soon after the fall of France, and went to Casablanca, where he remained several months before he obtained a passport to Lisbon and thence to the United States.

La Medina, located in the northwest section of Casablanca, Morocco, is enclosed by a high wall, with its back to the Atlantic. It is the old Moorish part of the city and later became the refuge for underground leaders, political fugitives and escaped French, Czech and Polish army officers.

It is with such refugees that the plot of "Casablanca" concerns itself. The action of the story takes place in Casablanca, with a flashback to Paris just prior to the German occupation, which tells of the love between Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman. Paul Henreid is cast as a prominent leader of the underground.

The supporting cast includes Claude Rains, Conrad Veidt, Gene Greenstreet and Peter Lorre. Michael Curtiz directed the screen play by Julius J. Philip G. Epstein and Howard Koch, who adapted from the novel by Michael Curtiz. "Casablanca" is the 51st production directed by Michael Curtiz in the 13 years he has been in America.

Among his numerous hits are "Captain Blood," "Captains of Clouds" and "Yankee Doodle Dandy."

Second feature with "Casablanca" at the McDonald is "Escape from Crime" with Bishop and Richard Travis.

Ann Savage, screen star, received an ivory and platinum statuette case with her initials. It belonged to a cameraman's brother who had the same initials.
