

Many Lane County Churches to Observe Palm Sunday

Holy Week Observation Arranged

The entire city of Eugene and adjacent communities are invited by the Eugene Ministerial association to unite in the special Holy Week services to be held Monday through Friday at the Central Presbyterian and First Baptist churches.

"For the first time in the history of Eugene an effort has been made to unite this vicinity in the faith and fellowship of the sufferings of our Lord," said Rev. Herman L. G. Smith, president of the association. "These are trying and testing days in which we live... world at war being drenched in the cup of strife and bitterness bringing death and destruction to many thousands of people who are innocent. Surely we should do our part to unite the cause which will bring salvation to the nations and individuals of the world: The recognition of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord."

Three services will be held daily. A morning broadcast will be held from 7:45 until 7:55 o'clock over radio station KORE. Dr. William G. Everson, president of Linfield college, will speak on all the programs and services except the three hour service on Good Friday.

Noon services will be held from 12:10 p. m. until 12:50 p. m. every day at the Central Presbyterian church, Tenth and Olive. This service is so arranged that those working downtown may attend. On Good Friday the service will be held from 9:30 until 10:30 a. m., the downtown stores and business houses having agreed to close until 11 a. m. The three-hour Good Friday service will be from 12 until 3 p. m.

Evening services will be held at the First Baptist church every evening Monday through Friday at 7:30 o'clock. Tuesday evening the service will be held at Central Presbyterian.

The ministerial association and churches of this vicinity expressed their gratitude for the cooperation of the business houses of the city in closing until 11 a. m. on Good Friday in favor of the morning service.

Church Notes

The First Methodist church of Eugene will dedicate its new altar cross at the Palm Sunday service, 11 a. m. and Dr. B. Earle Parker will bring the message. The annual Fellowship dinner will be held on Monday in the church dining room, with Dr. William Wallace Youngson of Portland bringing the Easter message. Music for the evening will be under the direction of Dr. Charles Hunt and Glenn Griffith.

The Lutheran churches of Eugene are observing Palm Sunday with confirmation services. Emmaus Lutheran will hold its confirmation at the morning service, beginning at 10:30 o'clock. Adult baptism and confirmation will be administered at Central Lutheran church at 11 a. m. New members will be received during the service and will be given membership certificates by the chairman of the council at the service. The Junior Lutheran league will give crosses made of palm branches to all the worshippers to remind them of the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem. A service of Holy Communion by candlelight will be held on Good Friday beginning at 8 o'clock. Pastor Aalbu will give meditations on the Seven Words from the Cross.

In the Palm Sunday morning service at Grace Lutheran church a children's class of catechumens will be received into the communicant membership of the church by the rite of confirmation. Special Holy Week services will be held on the evenings of Holy Thursday and Good Friday, beginning at 8 o'clock. Holy Communion will be celebrated on Thursday evening.

An illustrated sermon on "The Old Rugged Cross," will be presented at Lighthouse Temple by Lester Swaggart, local artist, Sunday evening. The morning service will be a Palm Sunday sermon, "Bring Back the King."

Bethesda Lutheran church at Danebo will hold confirmation services Sunday at 11 o'clock. Thursday night at 8 o'clock Holy Communion will be observed by the congregation.

Ebbett Memorial Methodist church of Springfield will have no evening service on Palm Sunday. Central Presbyterian church will hold Good Friday communion service with reception of members this Friday. This is particularly a young people's service, but everyone may attend.
