

OCD Changes Told By Coordinator

The placing of the air raid warning service on the alert basis, instead of a continuous 24-hour watch, finds corresponding changes in the civilian defense procedure and responsibility. Howard Merriam, Lane county coordinator of civilian defense, said on his return from a meeting in Salem, October 11, which was attended by county coordina-

tors and many officials. The civilian defense organization must be kept intact, Merriam said, and it will be essential that control centers, communication lines and key personnel be tested periodically. The protective division which has received most attention and training in the past is presumed to be capable of handling situations that may arise. The Lane defense coordinator said that it is contemplated that certain features of industry protection and similar responsibilities, now vested in the army and other government agencies, will be combined and placed under the defense council. Several Oregon communities have profited in the past by the training of the civilian defense protective division in the handling of natural disasters such as floods, and fires. More emphasis will be placed upon war service features in the future, such as bond sales, salvage drives, health campaigns, transportation economy and so on, the coordinator announced.

Bob Scott Joins U. S. Marine Corps

Bob Scott, night editor of the Register-Guard for the past six months, has been inducted into the marine corps, Sergeant L. L. Pittenger of the marine recruiting office, said Tuesday. Scott is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Lee Scott of Salem. He was a journalism student at the University of Oregon. Following a two week furlough he will report for duty at the San Diego marine base.

Logging Road to Smith River Done

The Oregon and California re-vested lands administration has practically finished constructing a 12-mile road into the Smith river area, scene of a disastrous forest fire several years ago, in which 25,000 acres of Douglas fir was burned.

The road into the area was built in order to facilitate the salvaging of sound timber. Floyd W. Scott, O and C forest management supervisor, explained. The fire was a crown fire and left much timber that can be used. Several lumber operators are in the area at present and in the spring another company plans to go in, Scott said. At the present time approximately a million feet of timber is being taken out per month. The complete salvage job will probably net around a half-billion feet of lumber.

Proceeds from such sales made by the O and C administration go 75 per cent to the state and county, and 25 percent to the O and C for administration. Scott built his road with a crew of 40 conscientious objectors from the CO camp at Elkton. The road will also be utilized for fire suppression.

Eugene Firms Low Bidders on Roads

Several Eugene firms entered bids with the state highway commission at Portland Tuesday, to supply various state highway projects with crushed rock or gravel. The E. C. Hall company were low bidders on projects in Crook, Deschutes, Klamath, Jackson and Wasco counties. Oscar E. Jolson company was low bidder to supply the project in Umatilla county. The bids totaled \$189,390. Contracts have not been awarded yet.

Alcoa Confirms Coast Lumber Deal

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 13.—A spokesman for the Aluminum Company of America said today the company is negotiating for an interest in the Pope and Talbot, Inc., west coast lumber mills and a subsidiary of the latter firm, McCormick Steamship Co. He said the facilities of Pope and Talbot and McCormick are desired by the aluminum company in conjunction with its west coast expansion program. Alcoa has several new plants in the states of Washington, California and Oregon, among them three Defense Plant corporation projects which the company is operating for the government. The McCormick fleet would be used in shipping Pope and Talbot products to the east coast and in supplying Alcoa plants in the west with material and equipment, the aluminum company spokesman explained.

Plane Bags 12 Nazi Fighters on Raid

A U. S. BOMBER STATION IN ENGLAND, Oct. 13.—(AP)—A new record of 12 German fighters shot down by one bomber on a single raid was set Sunday in the raid on Muenster by the Flying Fortress Ohio Airforce piloted by Lt. John Richey, Steubenville, O. The previous record was 11 planes.

Dinner Planned for Filter Center Crew

A dinner for filter center workers is planned for Saturday evening in the auditorium of the armory, Captain Ray Siegenthaler announced Tuesday. The dinner Captain Siegenthaler said, is being given the workers to honor them for the splendid work they have accomplished in Lane county defense.

Captain Siegenthaler and Captain Joseph A. Richards will preside during the dinner. They will explain the new defense set-up and will instruct the workers on plans for the future. Medals will be presented to those who have earned them during the period between October 4 and October 16. More than 346 civilian workers are expected to attend and 27 officers and enlisted men, Captain Siegenthaler said.
