

Dean Warren, 25, Dead in Portland

A man reportedly asphyxiated by gas from a hose attached to an auto exhaust in Portland Wednesday was identified by papers found upon him as Dean E. Warren, 25, formerly of Eugene, according to United Press reports.

Warren, whose current address was given as 727 Southwest Chestnut, Portland, was a member of an old family in Eugene, being the son of the late J. E. Warren, Eugene barber, and Mrs. Nellie Warren.

He was a nephew of H. C. and Richard Warren of Eugene and Ralph Warren of Cottage Grove; also Clyde Warren of Portland, now in Europe.

Dean Warren had graduated from University of Oregon in 1941 after his schooling had been interrupted by sickness for a year and a half, it was stated. He was reportedly engaged to Helen Lehto of Clatskanie. He graduated from Eugene high school in 1938.

At the university he had high scholastic rating, was a member of Scabbard and Blade, military science honorary.

Wednesday was his 25th birthday.

Funeral services are expected to be held in Eugene, though Dean's aunt, Mrs. Clyde Warren of Portland, had been unable to contact relatives in Eugene Wednesday, she stated to United Press.

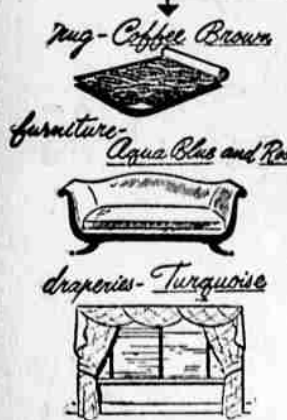

Francisco and other yards, including Eugene. Twenty-nine diesel engines are now on order. Ten G. S. engines have been assigned to the Oregon pool, for relieving the heavy traffic burden, and 20 of the big cab-ahead engines have been ordered, and some of them will be assigned to Oregon.

Few realize the importance of Eugene terminal in S. P. freight handling, Mercer pointed out. An average of ten freight "blocks" are made up in the local yard daily, a gathering of freight from all directions, and made up so that it does not require handling but makes a through haul clear to Ogden or as far south as Los Angeles. That gives great relief to other terminals along the way, said Mercer. The advantage of a flat yard here thus is utilized.

Because this has been made more a block terminal, the freight business as far south as Glendale on that line will be brought here and reflected in Eugene business, the president pointed out.

This terminal works nearly 1100 employees; 475 in the mechanical and car departments, including 72 women added the past year; 100 to 125 in bridge and maintenance of way; 400 train and engine men; 100 miscellaneous employees.

The terminal sees an average of 40 to 45 trains arrive and leave daily, not including half a dozen special trains and through passengers.

After the war, the company plans to enlarge its roundhouse here and has outlined maximum plans for the yard, to be installed

Japs Smashed—

Thunderbolt fighters scored a spectacular victory over 32 Japanese fighters and eight bombers in a battle near the enemy air base at Wewak, 185 miles northwest of Madang. Allied planes also were on the attack over the northern Solomons and in the Bismarck archipelago.

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN THE SOUTHWEST PACIFIC, Oct. 13.—(P)—Japan's badly mauled New Guinea airforce now has to reckon with a new sky menace—the P-47 thunderbolt.

Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters disclosed today that four of these new fighters piled into 32 Japanese fighters over Wewak, New Guinea, Monday and sent at least eight down to join the approximately 500 enemy aircraft which have been wiped out there since mid-August. Two others may have gone down.

The four thunderbolts were unscathed.

the republican vote and—with an eye chiefly on the south—penalizing states and districts that didn't.

The 10 states that cast their electoral votes for Wendell Willkie in 1940—Colorado, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Michigan, Nebraska, North and South Dakota, and Vermont—will get a bonus of three delegates at large. But in some of these states the gains will be offset by district delegate losses resulting from reapportionment.

Other States Listed

Eleven other states will benefit by a three-delegate bonus for electing republican senators in 1942 after failing to go republican in the 1940 presidential race. They are Delaware, Idaho, Illinois, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Oregon, West Virginia, and Wyoming.

Texas will have the largest delegate gain—seven—in the next convention. California will come next with six, all due to a pick-up of three new house seats under reapportionment. Oregon will gain five, including three for electing a republican senator in

War Games Ended In Central Oregon

FOURTH CORPS HEADQUARTERS, CENTRAL OREGON, Oct. 13.—(P)—The 75,000 troops engaged in central Oregon war games rested today following completion of their fifth maneuver problem yesterday.

The mock battle ended high in the mountains north of Fort Rock valley where a heavily-armed blue army had pushed red forces.

Maj. Gen. Alexander M. Patch, maneuver director, declared an armistice upon deciding that nothing further could be learned by the two armies in the problem involved.

Lifting of Weather News Ban Delayed

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 13.—(U.M.)—F. W. Reichelderfer, chief of the United States weather bureau in Washington, today ordered all local bureaus to continue forecasting under the restricted system pending complete publication and broadcast arrangements with the war and navy departments.

Reichelderfer said a new program governing weather forecasts for the entire nation will be completed soon.

The new order held up temporarily on office of censorship ruling which authorized newspapers to publish any weather information except unofficial forecasts.

Until final plans have been completed, Reichelderfer said, newspapers may print weather news only of their own localities after a 24-hour delay.

Argentine Cabinet Rumored Quitting

MONTEVIDEO, Oct. 13.—(P)—The newspaper Eldiario will announce in its evening edition today that private reports from Buenos Aires said the whole Argentine cabinet had resigned.

A crisis provoked by the earlier resignation of three ministers was said to have led the remaining members of Gen. Pedro Ramirez' government to walk out.
