

Two Routes Served by Free Bus

Starting Sunday, which also is Rally Day at the church, a free church bus will serve the two communities of Santa Clara and the River Road, for those who wish to attend services at the Santa Clara Church of Christ. Purchase of the bus, made in the past weeks, is result of long endeavor by the church board and pastor, the Rev. Jean M. Shelley. Need of the bus was felt even before gas shortage made personal use of automobiles practically nil. Because the bus will reduce such use of private cars, saving gas and tires, the government cooperates with the project, allowing gas purchase for the truck's use.

The bus, which will carry 40 passengers, will be driven by men of the church, with an adult in charge on all trips, so that parents need have no reluctance to let their children travel unaccompanied. The trip through the Santa Clara district will be between 9 and 9:30 a. m., making the first and second loop trips, by way of Spring Creek drive. The River Road trip, which will go south to Hansen Lane, will be from 9:30 to 9:50 a. m. If demand is sufficient, an evening run may be added.

The church in Santa Clara is located just opposite the grade school.
