

Portland Man's Will Sustained

SALEM, Ore.—(AP)—The State Supreme court affirmed a Multnomah circuit court decision sustaining the validity of the will of Isaac K. Davis of Portland, which had been contested by his daughter, Mrs. Katie Israel.

The will awarded the principal part of his estate to his wife, Mrs. Anna Davis, and named her as executrix.

In another decision the court reversed a Josephine circuit court decision awarding compensation from the state industrial accident commission to Clarence R. Stout for the loss of a hand while working near O'Brien as a carpenter.

The court ruled Stout was not an employe and the intervenor in his case, Eugene R. Brown, was not an employer under the intentment of Oregon law covering workmen's compensation.

French Gather Food For Liberation Fight

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Commenting on food shipments to North Africa for military purposes, President Roosevelt noted striking differences before and after the end of the Tunisian campaign and asserted that French authorities had begun to accumulate food for use during and after the liberation of France.

He told a news conference that he could not say when that would be.

Since July North Africa has been self-sustaining with respect to food—and no imports have been received, Mr. Roosevelt said.
