A U. S. BOMBER STATION, England, Oct. 21—(AP)—A gunless flying fortress, traveling across England on a routine night flight, unwittingly joined a formation of raiding German bombers in the belief they were Americans, it was revealed today.

whose guns had been dismantled, was piloted by First Lieut. Warren F. Bacon, Portland, Ore., who was not aware German planes were attacking a town near his destination as he approached his blacked-out landing field and asked the control tower for a flare to light his landing.

Only Bacon, his co-pilot and one passenger were aboard. "Right after I contacted the tower, I saw red and yellow flares popping all around," Bacon said. "I wondered why they fired so many flares."

### Wallace Assails Rail 'Plunderers'

DALLAS, Tex., Oct. 21—(AP)—Vice President Henry A. Wallace charged last night that Wall street-inspired "plunderers" are tightening their stranglehold on the nation's railroad empire and are plotting to seize control of new forms of transportation.

In a speech prepared for delivery before a meeting of civic and labor organizations here he said the industry's "financial manipulations" established and now are strengthening monopolistic controls of the railroads through illegal private rate-making practices they seek to extend to other transportation fields.

Calling their policy one of "the public be damned," he demanded they be stripped of their power by congress.
